Already heavily burdened with such problems as television, falling gate receipts and strengthening and enforcing their own codes of conduct, the NCAA members decided it would be too much to try to handle a nationwide rule covering the eligibility of individual athletes.

This had been proposed through an amendment to the NCAA constitution which would have applied the three-year eligibility rule and the one-year residence rule for transfer students to all conpetition by NCAA members. It now applies only to championship meets and tournaments or where separate conferences have their own/rule.

Several objections were raised, but when the delegates saw how much work by national committees would be involved, the aniendment was sunk on the convention of floor.


