are refugees themselves, having fled from persecution in Europe. In Mohammed Barghouty of the Arab Legion, a member of the Jordanian Arab Army's command, calls the border incidents "a part of high level policy."

Without them, he said, "Israel would not be the United States. Most of the aid for Israel comes from American Jews and is all war with the Arabs. When the borders have been quiet for a time, they always start trouble."

Substitute Treaty Bill Is Readied

Washington, Jan. 29 (AP)—Sen. Knowland of California, the Republican floor leader, announced today that a substitute for the Bricker treaty-power amendment will be introduced in the Senate today "with substantial democratic support."

Knowland declined at a news conference to say whether Sen. Bricker (R-Ohio), whose proposed constitutional amendment aroused vigorous opposition from Democrats, would join in offering the substitute. Other Senators said this seemed unlikely.

Sen. Bricker (R-Ohio) himself said yesterday the amendment on the administration on his proposal "grow out of a fundamentally different philosophy of government than the amendment which I proposed."

Knowland said that "substantial progress" had been made in attempting to find language on which liberal Republicans and Democrats could agree.

He declined to say, however, whether Sen. George D. Brown (D-Iowa), who proposed constitutional amendments on a similar basis, would support it. Bricker found unsatisfactory all the amendments proposed by the administration leaders and a generally friendly group of Senators.
