



"The Inquirer"

Lunching at noon yesterday with Mrs. J. M. Wabrek, of Benton St., who is in charge of the Herald's Wednesday Home Page and the column of advertising and miscellany, "The Inquirer," she appeared interested in a bit of its history.

It occurs to us that others might also like to hear that the column originated with Mrs. Edith Grant Kibbe, now of Florida, more than half a century ago, when she began writing a column of household hints, recipes and fashion notes, alternating with advertising items of interest to women.

The column ran then, as it does today, under the heading, "Feminine Topics," in the Hartford Courant, daily and on Sundays and the idea has been copied by papers all over the country.
