possessions of the United States are no longer considered income. If you are one of the 80,000 people who report their income on Form 1041, you do not even have to report such money. And if you are an old hand, you can make tax claims for what you paid on such allowances back to 1950.

Deadlines for 1950 claims are March 15, 1954. However, the ruling does not apply to "territorial" tax payments where an employee gets paid for difficult rather than more costly living conditions.

4. Depreciation schedules for business, once approved, will be changed in the future only for "special" and "convenience" reasons.

These include changes in the business, working a machine more or fewer hours and similar circumstances. Business men have, in the past, protested that one revenue agent would approve a schedule and another agent might come along and change it because he had different ideas.

Paulson, who can pay special taxes quarterly instead of monthly under a ruling by Commissioner of Internal Revenue T. Coleman, announced that he would pay a \$100,000 penalty, to be paid in 100 installments, to get a schedule approved by a revenue agent.

the railroad and the industry that depends on the railroad.

Watson said that Dumaine "felt with sincerity" that it was of vital importance to bring to the public and New England industry a practical psychology as a healing agent, improved roadways, increased operation of feeder lines and more frequent scheduling of freight and passenger trains.

Assuring that many connecting statements and half-truths would be avoided concerning the "capability and integrity of Dumaine as president of the railroad," Watson said that as a labor representative, he liked to remain neutral.

"Now is the time," "But," he added, "I think there comes a time when every man should stand up and be counted." In Bridgeport, one phase of the proxy fight for control of the New Haven may wind up in the Connecticut Supreme Court.

This possibility came last night when counsel for an anti-Dumaine stockholder, John T. Lane, said the move was under consideration. Lane sought to Superior Court yesterday an order permitting him to obtain immediately a list of the New Haven's stockholders' names.

John T. Callahan ruled Lane had shown "neither his right nor the necessity for having such a list. The petition was denied."

Lane's attorney, Philip T. Callahan, said the appeal to the state's highest court was being considered on Thursday.

"A small stockholder does have a right to examination of the corporation's books," Lane said. "The court's decision should be reversed."

Callahan's decision came from the bench after Lane admitted frankly that he sought the list to solicit proxies.

Lane said he is a candidate for election at the railroad's annual meeting in New Haven April 14 when 21 directors are to be selected.

The Surrender Revoked
 "I guess I didn't handle it too well."
 That somewhat useful statement from Army Secretary Robert T. Stevens, one of the Eisenhower administration, may be the key explanation of the abandoned position that administration found itself in yesterday—from which it could only escape by what amounted to copping out and unseating Secretary Stevens.

It now seems clear that Secretary Stevens went to his famous conference with Senator McCarthy and the three other Republican members of his committee with the good and honorable intention of accepting a decent settlement of the controversy if he could be obtained. It seems clear, furthermore, that he himself thought, as he received various informal assurances from the members of the committee that Army officers would be treated reasonably and decently in the future, that he had gained his important point—which was, simply, that Secretary McCarthy should not be allowed to abuse Army officers just because they were following orders.

It was at the next stage of the proceedings that Secretary Stevens fell into the clutches of men politically much more clever than he. He thought it would be understood, by some process of official and public confidence in himself, that he had not done any such thing as surrender.

When Dulles Comes Home

GIANT FOR THE FUTURE

Turbo-Hydrostatic propellers, and even newer types are under development for use on future high-speed transporters and bombers. First production models of the big propeller will fly soon in a Navy turboprop version of the Super Constellation. One of the largest propellers built, the Turbo-Hydrostatic dwards four regular propellers on the B-17 test installation shown above. This airplane, with a Pratt & Whitney Aircraft T-34 turboprop engine mounted in the nose, often can be seen flying in this area with only the one big propeller in operation.
