



28.5 Mill Tax Rate Levied On \$10,586,416 Grand List

Coventry

Coventry, March 5 (Special)—A 28 '2 mill tax rate was levied by the Board of Finance at a special meeting held at the Town Office Building last night. This new rate represents a half-mill boost over the mill rate on the 1952 grand list.

The corrected net grand list of 1953 is \$10,586,416, a net gain of some \$618,778 over the 1952 net grand list of \$9,967,628. The new corrected figure represents a drop of some \$31,000 from the original 1953 estimate given in January.

The new lax rate provides for full payment of \$15,384 for the new fire truck ordered in October for the South Coventry Volunteer Fire Company. It also includes an anticipated expenditure of \$18,000 for three new school buses, according to Albert J. Booth, Finance Board chairman.
