

Red Cross Campaign Starts Final Week Short of Quota

They attacked five through the jungle-covered hills where most of the Vietminh were entrenched two miles from the hill. The Vietminh were shot down in large numbers, and their tanks were destroyed.

Other squadrons roamed northward from the Vietminh hill-top links with Communist China, from which the rebels are getting their war supplies.

But up for big push. The Vietminh built up fresh stocks of ammunition for their new attempt to smash the hill and score a big victory before the big powers meet in Geneva.

Approve Change Rule Changes

Kansas City, March 22 (AP)—The National Basketball Committee today imposed a stiffer penalty on players committing fouls by jumping into the air and waving their arms in favor of a "bonus" free throw.

The committee, headed by Chairman Bruce Drake of Oklahoma, also returned the game to the two halves for 40-minute college games, eliminating the quarter system.

Players are allowed to apply to high school or other games which are less than 40 minutes in length.

Free Throw Rule

The new free throw rule puts a premium on good shooting by allowing a second free throw on a common foul short of a foul on a made shot. If the first shot is missed the ball is in play. The rule will apply only to the first 37 minutes of the game.

During the last three minutes of play, the 1953 rule, two free throws are awarded in effect.

During the past two seasons a second shot has been awarded after a foul committed during the last three minutes.

The National Basketball Coaches Association had recommended the rule apply during the full game.

"We want to make it a 40-minute game and you should not realize this is just about impossible to do in late minutes of the game," Coaches Approve.

Coaches of the United States and Canada indicated in a questionnaire by a vote of almost 8 to 1 that they were generally satisfied with the rule as they were, but favored revising the one-minute rule.
