By FRANK R. BOFFMAN, Washington, March 24 (AP)—Rep. Yorty (D-Calif.) said today that Eisenhower administration made a "grave error" in cutting off air power and that it has "tried to hide its error" by coming up with a "New Look" concept in national defense.

Yorty issued an attack on an administration air policy in a speech prepared for a National Aeronautics conference sponsored by the CIO United Auto Workers.

"Air power is not the playing of the party in power," he said. "It can only be built up over a period of years, through non-partisan support."

Portland, Me., March 24 (AP)—Columbia, Conn. woman today had custody of two orphaned grandchildren after Supreme Court Judge Sidney Thaxter ruled in her favor.

The decision, announced yesterday, was based on a habeas corpus petition filed by Mrs. Marion K. Hurbutt and opposed by Dr. and Mrs. George L. Geer, Jr., of South Portland.

That Grumbling Is Webster Turning over in His Grave

Washington, March 23 (AP)—With the tourist season hard upon us, it's time for those who are going abroad to get some pointers on books and try for a smattering of whatever foreign language they may wish to acquire. For Americans, this includes the English language. The King's English is not the English we all speak. You speak English in a foreign tongue? All right, then, what does "English" mean? The "Housey-Housey" in a sentence. Tell us what an "ark" is and over up—no cribbing now—whether you'd like some "Tottenham pudding" for dinner.

These are English words, honest, though most of them are slang. You can find them—and a lot more you may need if you're London-bound—in a recently published book, "A Dictionary of New Words in English," by Paul C. Berg (Crowell, \$2.50).

Berg, an Englishman, got together some thousands of words which have come into common use since the 1930s. This shows how the world has changed in 20 years. Back in those innocent days "radio boom" wasn't even in the dictionary.

Neither, for that matter, was "grumpy," which turns out to be Royal Air Force (RAF) slang for a successful bombing raid, or "Chavez keeps seat; Ouster Move Fails."

It also held that political machines dominating the New Mexico voter registration system "grossly violated" the law; almost 100,000 voters were misled by precinct election officials; legality of votes cast by 1,900 persons living on military reservations could not be determined; and 13,000 ballots were burned illegally.

The Democrats contended the investigation and records demanded by Hurley turned up no evidence to change the result of the election.
