Mundt Says Case Starts In 10 Days

Washington, April 1 (P)— The Senate Investigations subcommittee today appointed Samuel P. Sears, a Boston lawyer, as special counsel for its investigation of the charges Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis) and high Army of-ficials have aimed at one an-

Sen. Mundt (R-SD), who will pre-side at the public and televised hearings, told a news conference he believed the unanimous selection had broken a log jam and would permit start of the inquiry within 10 days.

Mundt said Sears will start work Monday "and I hope the hearings will start the following week."

Mundt said the selection was made by "another unanimous vote, all six members of the committee voting 'aye' "at a closed door session."

Just a few moments earlier. Sen. 




