Nehru Asks **Big Powers** Avoid Strife

(Continued from Page One) four-power agreement for non-intervention would bar any kind of interference, such as furnishing troops and war material. Eventually it would be incorporated in a U. N. non-intervention treaty open to other nations.

France was not included among those requested to keep hands off ndochina. But Nehru said the Paris government should give assurances at Geneva that she is faking steps to grant full independence to the Indochinese states of Viet Nam, Laos, and Cambodia.
