Washington, May 19 (AP)—President Eisenhower today called for the McCarthy-Army hearings to continue, but said the chips fall where they lay.

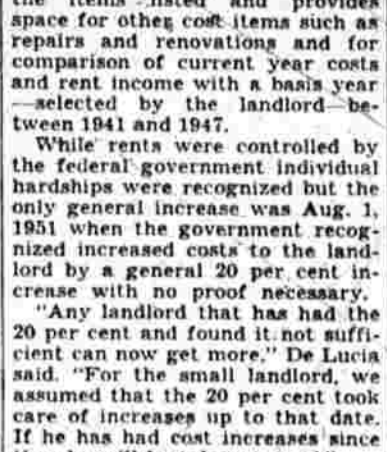

Not a Valid Alibi

The emergence of the fundamental issue in the Army-McCarthy controversy, which is whether or not the executive branch is to be dominated by an aggressive individual of the legislative branch, has been converted into at least a temporary halt to the hearings themselves, by Senator McCarthy with the support of the Republican members of the investigating committee. These Republican members may be both sympathetic to McCarthy, in some degree, and also feeling their own status as members of the legislative branch.

The fact that President Eisenhower's assertion of the independence of the executive branch of government has come tardily, and has come in the form of a refusal to permit this investigation to obtain certain information which obviously seems pertinent to its inquiry, does give Senator McCarthy a footing for his own object—which would be, naturally, to have the hearings abandoned with only one side having undergone the ordeal of cross-examination.

It is easy to follow his argument. Here he and the committee were, presuming that they were investigating certain policies on the part of Army Secretary Stevens and Army Counsel Adams and certain policies on the part of McCarthy and Cohn on the other, when it is suddenly revealed that Stevens and Adams may not have been primarily responsible for their own policies.

If their policy was to "get McCarthy," it would now seem to be indicated that this was actually a White House plot. If they were engaged in a plot against McCarthy, it now seems that it may have been a White House plot. If what they have done was decided upon at an administration conference, what was said at that conference would certainly throw light on the motives behind the policy they carried out. In fact, for a full and explicit understanding of how this whole controversy began, the knowledge of what went on at the conference which decided upon policy would be essential.

So McCarthy complains, quite plausibly, that he is now blocked in any effort to show motive for the Army's role in the controversy. He is understandably angry, not only because he is blocked, but also because the main fact involved is clear, even if he cannot delve into its details. This main fact is that the challenge to him has come from the whole Eisenhower administration, not just from one or two Army administration officials, as he had liked to pretend, up to this point.

But, although it is true that McCarthy is blocked from spreading upon the public record the intimate details of the administration decision to challenge him and his assumption of powers, there is in that no valid reason for suspending the investigation itself. What is involved is something that should have been considered obvious all along—that President Eisenhower's Secretary of the Army would not be out there on the front line fighting McCarthy without the knowledge and approval of the higher executive authority to which he is responsible.

It is not essential to the course of the inquiry, which should concern which side has told the truth in its account of the events which preceded and followed the decision to challenge McCarthy, to have the detailed conversation with which that administration decision was made. One side or the other in this controversy has spread a whole network of lies on the public record, and these lies concern

things which happened directly between the two sides of the controversy. It is the purpose of these hearings to determine which side has told these lies—and to plunge that side into national discredit and ignominy. If that cannot be determined without the details of administration conversations, it cannot be determined with them. And if McCarthy has nothing to fear, he has no valid reason for trying to terminate the hearings now, however much he may smart under the knowledge that it was the Eisenhower administration which built it up enough to constitute something more serious than a false lure for prospectors.

Senator McCarthy has repeatedly proclaimed and with some accuracy, that this whole controversy represents an effort to "smear" McCarthy and Cohn. And it is, unfortunately, that. It is true that a great and decent administration has come down to the use of that kind of weapon against him, and is indeed engaged in an effort to destroy him by discrediting him and exposing him for the American people to see.

Yet if the "smear" is not there, in the facts, it will not stick. If he is innocent of the charges against him, the ultimate triumph will be his. Neither he nor the committee have any right to shift themselves out of continuing the investigation with the claim that they can't tell whether the smear is true because they don't know the exact words with which the policy of attacking McCarthy was decided upon.

As for the reasons such a policy was decided upon, President Eisenhower himself might properly give them, as, indeed, he has already done, to some extent, in his executive order. The President might well give such a basic explanation to the committee and to the country, and give everybody plainly enough the fundamental reasons why the executive branch did what it did. That would answer the main question McCarthy claims he has a right to ask, and give the committee what it needs to assist its own judgment in the matter. But, in any case, the committee, which last week even refused to take the hearings behind closed doors, has no valid pretext for now abandoning them altogether.

Tarac Surrenders
A Communist leader, symbol of the type we fear in Indo-China, in India, in Guatemala, in Italy, and practically everywhere, the opportunity exists for exploitation of economic and social discontent, walked out the other day and surrendered to a democratic government.

He was Luis Tarac, the long-time leader of the Huk in the Philippines. He was the leader of a nationalist, agrarian reform movement which, like such movements elsewhere, found it natural to become allied with Communism. The other day he walked out of the jungle and surrendered to the government of President Macaragay, who, before his election, had been a rather ferocious champion against the Huk in the field.

Perhaps his military campaigning had something to do with Tarac's decision to surrender. But certain other things can be presumed to have played a part, too. One was President Macaragay's offer to take all Huk who did surrender and re-settle them on newly developed land. Another was the fact that President Macaragay, after defeating the reactionary Quirino regime in the presidential election, announced a vigorous program of economic action for the Philippine people.

In short, it was not areas alone which brought out of the jungle, in the first such surrender of this era, a leader symbolic of the almost universal alliance between Communism and backwardness. A demonstration that the Philippines were going to act as if they were free, as they are, and use that freedom for the benefit of the Philippine people, cut the ground beneath that usual combination of native and Communist causes, and left those who would continue in rebellion on Communist itself as a cause. On that basis, Tarac could not, and did not choose to keep going. In this, there is a lesson for the western world as it considers other situations in which Communism is exploiting native economic and social discontents.

Teasing The Prospectors
Reports from the west reveal that the Geiger counters are jumping merrily, putting our uranium hunters into a sudden fever. And the assertion of a physicist, to the effect that this whole country is experiencing some minor fall-out of radioactive materials as a result of the recent explosions in the Pacific, tells why.

The Geiger counters do not show anything dangerous. They merely jump five or six times above their normal rate, just just enough to make the poor prospectors think they may be

near some lode. But, since the counters will behave this way on almost any street, the prospectors soon adjust their readings to consider the present slight increase of radioactivity everywhere the normal thing. The interesting question, so which we have not yet seen the answer, is that of how long this slight trace of radioactivity from the far Pacific blasts, after it settles on American streets. If it should have a long life, too many explosions over a period of time might build it up enough to constitute something more serious than a false lure for prospectors.

C. E. Ives Passes, Noted Composer

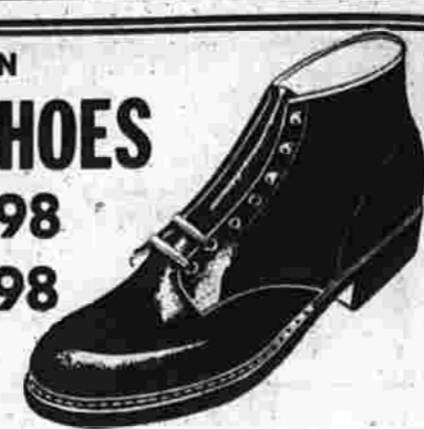
New York, May 19 (AP)—Charles E. Ives, 79, American composer and Pulitzer prize winner, died early today at Roosevelt hospital. Ives, who wrote music as a hobby, was a partner in the insurance brokerage firm of Ives & Myers, one of the largest businesses of its kind in the country. He began his business career as a clerk for the Mutual Life Insurance Co. and later formed his own firm.

The composer lived quietly at his homes in Manhattan and West Redding, Conn., rarely attending concerts or social functions. In 1947, he was awarded a Pulitzer prize for his third symphony, which had been written 33 years earlier.

Many of Ives' works have never been performed. His compositions, found "too difficult" by some conductors and performers, have been described by critics as "half a century ahead of their time." Working completely by himself, he developed techniques of harmony, rhythm and antonality similar to those found 10 to 15 years later in the works of Schoenberg and Stravinsky in Europe. All of Ives' symphonies, sonatas and other orchestral works were written before 1915. Since then and until shortly before his death he composed nothing but songs, of which he wrote some 200. As a student at Yale, Ives studied composition under Horatio Parker, a prominent teacher and composer. Ives, who was born in Danbury, Conn., is survived by his widow and a daughter.

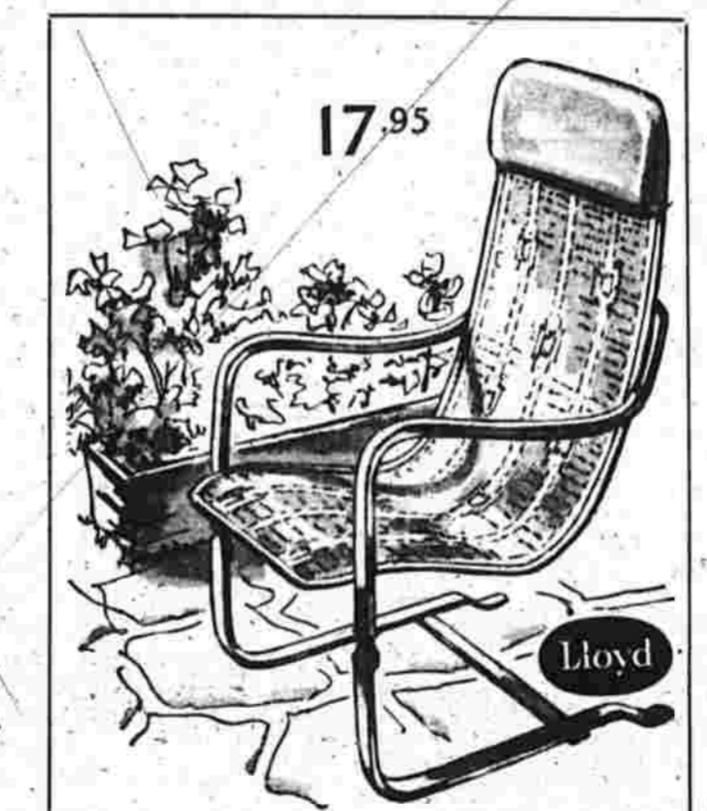

Jailed Bankrupt Paying Creditors by Inventions

Canon City, Colo., May 19 (AP)—A bankrupt businessman is trying to make a million and a half dollars behind the lowering state walls of the Colorado Penitentiary.

Fred Ward, convict 27388, a cook at the prison farm, has been serving 7 to 15 years for fraud connected with the crash of his automobile distribution at Denver in July 1951.

Ward uses any spare time he can arrange to type the four letters he is allowed to write each week. One goes to his wife Eva, and their teenage son and daughter at Corona Del Mar, Calif., where Mrs. Ward operates a gift shop. The other letters are to his attorney in Denver and to persons receiving sales of his gadgets.

"Fred Ward has been a nondescript prisoner," said Warden Harry make a comeback in business.

He is counting on several tangible assets and some new ideas to retire the state debt.

"I'll pay back my creditors every cent that I owe," promised the once-lambent spender. "And I'll make a comeback in business."

The major asset is a transparent plastic nylon stretching water which is being marketed nationally for \$1.99 by a Denver distributor. It is stapled like a football and has a removable cap. Women's nylon and underthings are placed in the gadget with a cocktail mixer to rub the articles against smooth film running the length of the interior.

Ward said he got the idea after reading a magazine article which suggested that he use the film as a fruit jar.

He also has arranged with prison guards to manufacture children's blocks in their off-duty hours. "One day they'll be on the market very soon," Ward said, "a dripless saucer that will make a big hit with restaurants. He described it as a plastic saucer placed in the center with tiny drain channels to carry spilled coffee away from the bottom of the cup.

Additional items Ward distributes through firms outside the prison walls are a chemical detergent and a plastic shoe for children's shoes.

Amoebic Dysentery Is Very Important Hazard to Health
