



To the Editor; If Bolton voters should vote "YES" in the June 14 referendum, they will surrender great powers to a Regional School District. These powers are stated in detail in Sec. 731C to 758C of the 1954 Supplement to the Conn. General Statutes.

> These powers are: 1-The district shall be run by Regional Board of Education of not less than 5 nor more than members. Even if Bolton should get one more member than any of the other towns, it could easily b outvoted: Bolton's temporary comentering the study, but it was out

2 The Regional Board of Education may "select, and purchase property for school purposes, build add to, equip and organize a school or schools, may purchase school busses, and may include other grades of the public schools." The only limitations on these powers are: the school must be in the town voted in the June 14th referendum, the building can only be built after the bonds have been voted by the District and other grades may be added or scho busses purchased only after a vote of the District. Bolton voters do not vote on the

building but on the bond issue and their vote is subject to the decision of the majority of the voters i the District as provided in No. 3. 3-After voting "YES" in the June 14 referendum the District becomes a "Body Politic" and all future voting is decided by a majority of the voters in the district. hat is, the "yes" and "no" votes of all the towns are added together and the majority decides. To indicate how easily Bolton may be outvoted, consider the 1950 population census of the towns to e included in the Regional School District: Andover 1,034, Hebron 1,320, Marlborough 901 and Bol-

4-To operate the schools the Regional Board of Education draws up a yearly budget, holds a public hearing, then adopts the budget they wish. The individual townspeople or town Boards of Finance have no vote on this budget. The Regional Board of Education may borrow up to \$100,000, without a vote of the district on 5-year notes for any reason they deem necessary. These notes become obligations of .6 - If Bolton should want t leave the Region, it may do s only if the majority of the voters in the Regional School District. voting as described in No. 3, vote ; provided its withdrawal does not impair Bolton's obligation to the holders of any bonds issued by the District. If permitted t leave it must make agreements with the remaining towns to ad-

just any inequities resulting from its withdrawal. In other words, it must buy its way out. Before we surrender these powers, let us think long and careporary Regional School Commit ee estimated we will have 495 pupils in the top 6 grades by 1963, enough for Bolton to have a first class high school of its own. Should we, on such short notice. surrender such great powers and tie ourselves up with a 20-year capital and interest cost of ap-proximately \$700,000 after State Grants (taken from Temporary Regional Planning Committee's figures) when we have the alternative of sending only the top four grades to Manchester for the very short period from 1957 to

1963 or until we want to build our own school? Remember, when you vote "NO" on June 14 you do not surrender great powers to a Regional School District which can easily be conrolled by the people from other Cut this letter out, study it, and discuss it with your neighbors. Bolton Research League





McCarthy vs. Army In Capsule Form

Washington, June 2 (P) Here is a brief rundown on the Senate Investigations Subcommittee's inguiry into the dispute between Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis) and top Army officials:

The original charges - Secretary of the Army Stevens and Army counselor John G. Adams accused McCarthy and two subcommittee aides, Roy M. Cohn and Francis P. Carr, of using improper pressures to win favored Army treatment for Pvt. G. David Schine, a subcommittee aide who was drafted.

McCarthy and his associates in turn accused Stevens and Adams of attempting to use Schine as a "hostage" in efforts to induce Mc-Carthy to halt or divert an investigation of alleged subversives in the Army, particularly at Ft. Mon-mouth, N. J. They also accused Asst. Secretary of Defense H. Struve Hensel of seeking to discredit the subcommittee.

The subcommittee voted 4-3 on May 26 to dismiss Carr and Hensel as principals.

Cohn said Stevens and Adams repeatedly sought to stop the Ft. Ionmouth investigation. He said Adams referred to Schine as "the hostage" more often than he used Schine's name, and that Adams once said he would "stop at nothing" to block a subcommittee nove to question members of the Army's top loyalty board. Cohn denied Army testimony that he had once "declared war" on the Army when barred from a secret adar laboratory at Ft. Monmouth. continued his point-by-point refuation of testimony by Stevens and Adams, saying they mistaken or had not given the full sicture. He termed Adams' statement that Cohn once threatened
