Rockville-Vernon Voters Back High School Proposal at Town Meeting

Rockville, June 16 (Special)—At a special town meeting last night at the Town Hall all 209 townsmen present voted that the town erect and equip a new high school as recommended by the special fact finding committee. The sentiment was in marked contrast to the tumultuous sessions which took place when the town was in the process of voting its first additions to its educational facilities.

First Selectman Herbert Pagani called the meeting and Selectman Franklin W. Lyle was elected moderator. John G. Talcott, Jr., chairman of the fact finding committee, read the complete report of the committee giving recommendations previously announced and projected enrollment figures.

The meeting voted to accept the report and at the close, upon the motion of Irving Twomey, a vote of thanks was given to the fact finding committee which has been working since Feb. 2.

It was voted to appoint a committee of nine members to be known as the Vernon High School Building Committee, with the members being authorized to fill any vacancies which may occur, to make the necessary arrangements and plans for the erection of a high school, including provisions for hiring an architect and taking a proposed site.

Upon being questioned by several of those present, Chairman Welles said it would be necessary to report back to a town meeting when details were ready for action by the voters.

The following committee was named: John G. Talcott, Jr., Mrs. Margaret Small, Allen Schaefer, Joseph McManus, William Ladd, John Franklin Welles, Mrs. Alice Hammer, Allen Dresser and Joseph McCusker.

Other Business Conducted

A resolution was presented by Atty. Harry H. Lugg that the selectmen and other officers of the town be authorized to carry out the terms of the trust fund of the late Ruth Talcott Britton, who died in 1926. It was explained that the Talcott Bros. Co. was left \$2,000 in trust, the income to be used in Talcottville for tennis courts and other recreational grounds; but if Talcott Bros. should dissolve it should be the property of the town, the income to be used in the same manner.

In reply to a question, it was explained that the income would be used only in Talcottville and not in other parts of the town. Town Clerk Kerwin Elliott said the town had no trust officer and he felt the handling of the fund would be an expense to the town.

After an explanation that the expense could be taken from the fund's income, it was voted to accept the trust fund, with only a few voting against it.

County Commissioner Francis Prichard presented a resolution that the town allow the county to make alterations to the facilities now used in the Memorial Building. Irving Campbell questioned the additional expense to the town in its proportionate county payment and Allen Schaefer asked if the county paid for the facilities.

Atty. Lugg gave a brief history of the manner in which the county obtained the facilities for its court purpose and brought out the fact of the large additional expense to the town should it be necessary to build and maintain a county building. Permission to make the alterations was unanimously voted.

Porter Hopeful Region School Will Be Reality

Local Contractors Criticized

Thrall's price is \$23,216 annually. But three local bus contractors state that their combined bid is really low, being \$21,109.

The local contractors are Floyd A. Pough, Carlton H. Jones and Robert Rathbone, representing Elled, Hebron and Amston sections respectively. The School Board some little time ago purchased the purchase of its own town buses, which it was claimed would save the town \$10,000 or so annually.

Manilla, 16.—The Philippines have eyes set on the world fiber market. Ramie is the island's best bet although abaca, cotton, jute and kenaf are getting attention from government agronomists now experimenting in a 1,282-acre plantation at Davao in Mindanao.

Philippine ramie plants are among the world's tallest, 10 feet or more, have high tensile strength and are convertible into various textiles.

Another fiber the islands hope to place on a better competitive position is jute which grows wild. The threatened decline of jute production in Pakistan because of a food shortage there is expected to give Philippine jute a place in the world market.

The Buttons Push Themselves; Automatic Plants Big Business

It sounds like science fiction—but it's true. A dramatic example of this process already in operation at a Thompson Products Inc. plant in Cleveland.

The part looks like an old drum with a complex series of grooves. The old method (last year) of cutting the grooves was done by hand. Now, once the machine is started, buttons begin pushing other buttons and a finished part is turned out every three minutes and 20 seconds.

From \$1,500 to 50 cents. This fantastic machine costs \$500,000 and is made by the Hazlett Engineering Co. of Detroit.

One of the foremost authorities on automatic factories is a young engineer-businessman named John Diebold. He became interested in automatic control while working on a radio in the Merchant Marine Academy during the war.

Diebold envisioned a tremendous future for automatic control. In 1942 he authored a book entitled "Automation"—a new word meaning both operation and establishment of the automatic process.

Will Read Magazine. Last year young Diebold set up his own consulting company to advise companies on how to adapt their machine tools to automatic production.

"These machines are not futuristic things," says Diebold. "Approximately 1000 companies are already making automatic factory equipment."

For instance, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology has developed a tape controlled milling machine that will soon be ready for the commercial market.

At the present time, the machine turned out in a few hours a curved, complex aluminum product for the Air Force which Government technicians had spent almost two years trying to get made.

When this is done and the congressional leaders understand clearly what has happened in the Korean conversations, Eisenhower went on, the next step will be for the 16 allies to report to the U.N. their failure to reach an agreement.

On another vital question President Eisenhower said he is giving no thought now as to whether he will seek reelection in 1956.

The President's remarks regarding 1956 were touched off by a newsmen's reminder that Eisenhower's chief aide, Sherman Adams, suggested last week that Eisenhower might not run again for the presidency if the Republicans were to lose control of Congress in the next election.

Eisenhower was asked whether such a political development in November might have this effect on his plans.

He paused for a moment, then laughed. Then Eisenhower went on to say that to his best knowledge the matter of what he will do in 1956 never yet has been discussed by him, except perhaps in a facetious manner.

The President said he was not going to make any prediction at that matter. He added to a round of laughter, that what happens then is sufficient unto the day and the evil thereof.

Other Answers

The news conference questions dealt with several matters, among them:

Farm legislation—The President again declined to say whether he would veto any bill to continue government price supports at a fixed 90 per cent of parity, instead of providing for a shift to the flexible price support system advocated by the administration.

In response to a question, Eisenhower said he never had advocated government price supports at 100 per cent of parity. He said he was talking of 100 per cent of parity in the market place, and stressed that he feels there is a big difference.

Parity is a standard designed to give farmers a fair return for their products in relation to the cost of the things they buy.

On another farm matter, the President declined to say whether himself on a House Agriculture Com-

mittee proposal to hike the price support level of butter and dairy products to 80 per cent of parity from the present 70 per cent. He said that specific idea has not been brought to his attention, but that he is very much in favor of the idea of gradualism in dealing with farm problems.

The thing he is trying to do, Eisenhower went on, is to prevent rapid fluctuation in farm prices.

On Red Trade

Red trader Eisenhower declared he is not so sure just what the results would be if the United States and other free nations were to cut off all trade with Russia and the satellite nations.

The President was told that Rep. Dies (D-Tex.) had suggested that the best way to hit the spread of Communism would be to cut off shipment of all goods, including non-strategic materials now shipped to the Soviet Union.

Eisenhower replied that it was very difficult to know just what would occur if all trade with Iron Curtain countries were ended. He said if such a thing happened the inevitable effect would be to build up satellite states away from Moscow.

What we are striving for is a kind of centrifugal force which would have the effect of driving satellites away from their dependence upon Russia.

Unemployment insurance—In connection with his call last week for action in Congress to broaden the unemployment insurance program, Eisenhower was asked whether he plans to ask the states to call special sessions of their legislatures to help carry out such a program.

He replied he intends to point out to the states the advantages of taking action on the matter. But he added that he does not think it would be proper to say to Gov. Arn of Kansas, for example, that he ought to call a special session.

Guatemala—The Communist situation in Guatemala is very disturbing to Americans, Eisenhower said, particularly in the light of our assistance to the last few days. He said he was referring to suspension of constitutional rights and to arrests of anti-Communist leaders in the Red-tinted Central American nation.

What has been happening, Eisenhower said, is that the Communists have been set forth in more than one other country.

His remarks were prompted by a newsmen's statement that Secretary of State Dulles had ordered yesterday to Communist terrorism in Guatemala.

Eisenhower said the recent inter-American conference in Caracas, Venezuela, was designed to deal with such situations and this government consequently is in high contact with other American nations on

how to deal with what has happened. The matter, he said, is under most urgent study.

The "Opposition" case—the President was told that the Senate House Atomic Energy Committee has said that if the Atomic Energy Commission votes in effect to limit the congressional committee would insist on questioning members of the commission.

The Doctor Says

THERE ARE MANY METHODS OF DEALING WITH BAD ODOR FROM FERBRATION

By EDWIN P. JORDAN, M. D., Written for NEA Service

What is evidently a common and distressing complaint is perspiration having a bad odor. Sometimes it appears to be located principally in the armpits, sometimes in the feet and sometimes elsewhere. Today's first letter is an example.

Q—My son and I both have excessive perspiration of the feet which has a bad odor. We have tried many different foot powders without satisfaction. Have you any suggestions? Mrs. S. W.

A—Some foots like onion or gar-

lic and a few medicines may be excreted in the sweat and give it an offensive odor. The general health may occasionally affect the local perspiration.

More commonly, perhaps, the perspiration in certain places serves as a good spot for the growth of certain germs which cause the odor of the skin, causing it to have an offensive odor.

Perhaps the most useful measure to combat this process are certain aluminum preparations which are present in most of the commercial deodorizing sold in drugstores.

Q—Please give the cause of valley fever and describe the symptoms.

A—This disease is known by several different names and is caused by a fungus which enters the body either by being breathed in through a scratch.

The disease is particularly frequent in southern California, but present throughout most of the southwest and may be spreading eastward.

It may cause no symptoms whatever, but it also produces fever, headache, chills, backache, cough and other signs of infection in some cases. Recovery is usually rapid and complete.

Q—What harm (if any) does grapefruit do to a person with a bad heart and hardening of the arteries?

A—No harm at all so far as I know.

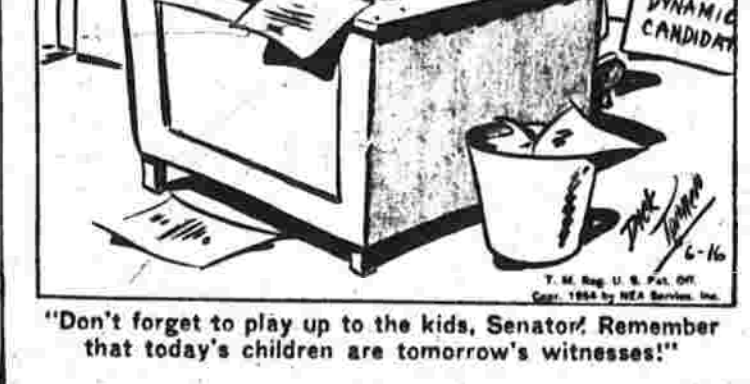

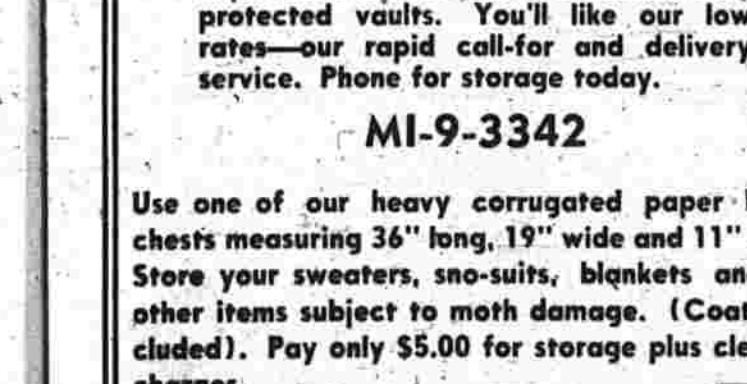

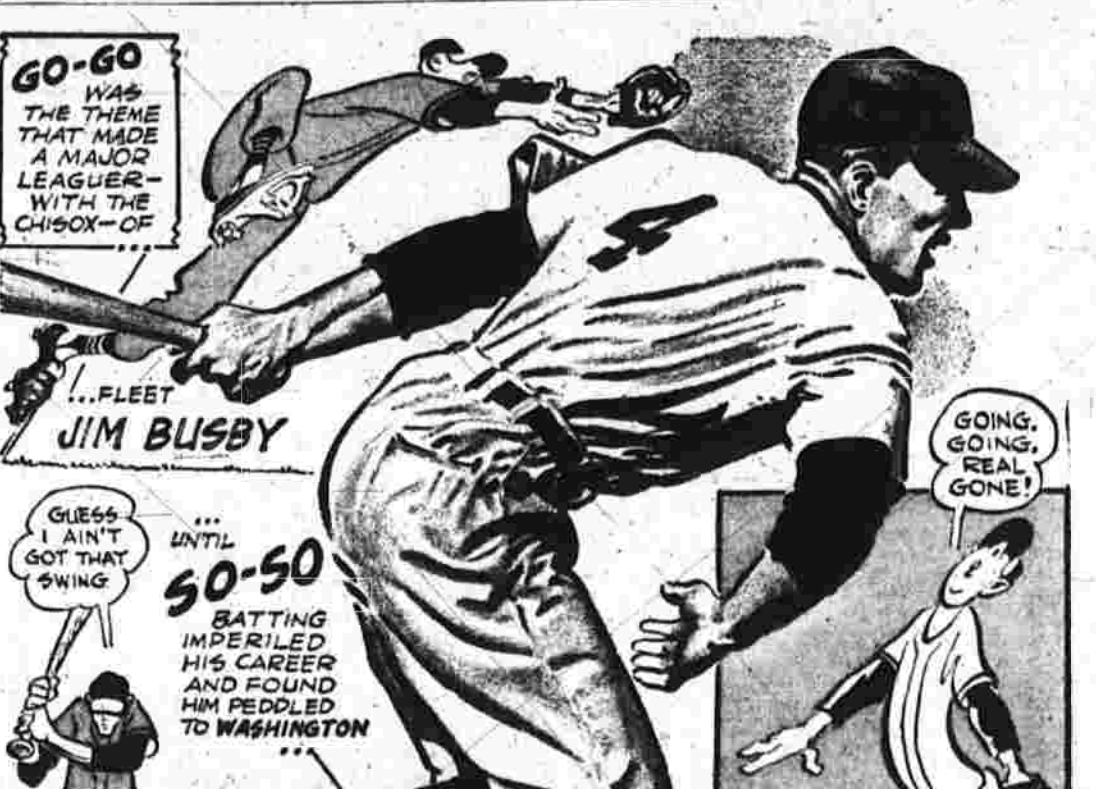
