United Nations--Boon or Boondoggle?

United Nations, New York (NBA)—Is the United Nations a boon—or a boondoggle? Everybody has his own opinion about this organization which, among many things, feeds Asian children, whose stomachs are swollen with hunger, protects the Tsimshian wolf—and makes Russia pay U. S. income tax.

Barely its original concept—to maintain peace and security—has failed, just as the post-war world has failed. Nations are attacking H-bombs—not goodwill.

But while most people have lost faith, few suspect liquidating UN through one extreme group thinks this building would make an excellent hospital.

Meanwhile, the political machinery of the UN must be maintained like a warship in mothballs for possible emergency use. The citizens of many nations hired to maintain it will probably never die of overwork, but have we a right to question their alibi?

What few understand is that besides running an international political debating society, the UN directly or indirectly is involved in several ways against disease and stupidity.

Some of these ways look like a boon—some like a boondoggle. If a mighty TV camera could scan the earth it would pick up this kind of footage:

In the tiny mud and clay village of Schabbara, in India, young boys line up before a blue turbaned UN field worker to be tested for tuberculosis.

There's a real estate boom in the Quidus section of Afghanistan. Max-acre parcels that a few years ago cost \$1 are now going for \$2000. The reason: UN teams taught malaria control, you now live there without mosquito netting or quinine.

Outside of Bangkok, in Thailand, UN experts breed fish for hungry stomachs in the Philippines, Indonesia, Malaya, Ceylon and Indochina. They feature a fish named Tlapia, which resting comfortably in a bathtub can produce a leaching underwater city yearly. Each female has 400 small fry every 60 days.

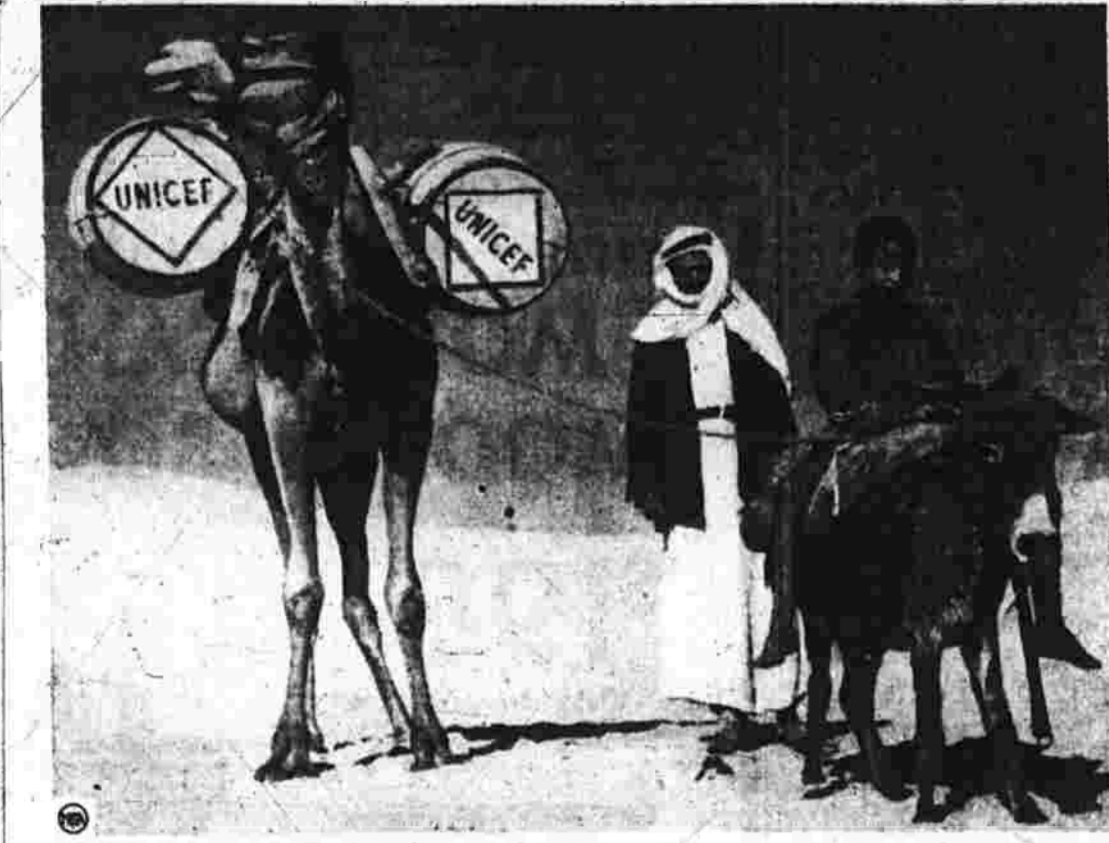
In the sleepy tropical hamlet of Plared, in Indonesia, the UN "Mr. Flute" has revolutionized the clay pot industry. They revolutionized production methods and a year later wages went up 120 per cent.

Not even Visiting can publicly object to X-raying the lungs of a kid with a hacking cough or swabbing a vicious bug. It's a UN version of "Point Four" and like all do-good projects it's as good as its administration.

This correspondent has met UN field workers as dedicated as missionaries. And he's seen several who circulate in the best gin mills on expense accounts. Their dispatches to this GHQ would win a fiction critic's approval.

The UN says its employees should not pay taxes on UN salaries to their own countries. Every nation agrees, except us. If the UN pays a Yank \$10,000 and pays our Internal Revenue Department \$1000, the UN reimburses him that sum.

The next year the U. S. taxes him on the reimbursement \$1100, please. This money mounting tax and reimbursement has been going on in some cases for nine years.

And the most fantastic note in the dis-united United Nations is that the Soviet Union, which pays part of the reimbursement, is thus paying income tax to the United States.

Eisenhower told the lawmakers that about \$2,748,400,000 of the total requested in new appropriations or about 70 per cent, is earmarked for programs "essentially of a military nature."

Dividing the total geographically, approximately 800 million dollars is for Europe, 570 million for the Near East, Africa and Asia, \$1,770,000,000 for the Far East and Latin America. About 165 million is requested for non-regional programs.

The President's message said the foreign aid program is based upon the south premise that there can be no safety for any of us except in co-operative efforts to build and maintain the strength of all free peoples."

He said that above all else Communist strategy seeks to divide isolates and weaken.

"The mutual security program is an important means by which to carry out this strategy," he added. "It helps us to bolster strength in remote areas which are, nevertheless, vital to our own security."

"It is mutually advantageous to our own economy and to the economies of the countries to which we give assistance. It meets the Communist menace at the front-line with practical and effective measures. It serves the ultimate purpose of our foreign policy by ex-

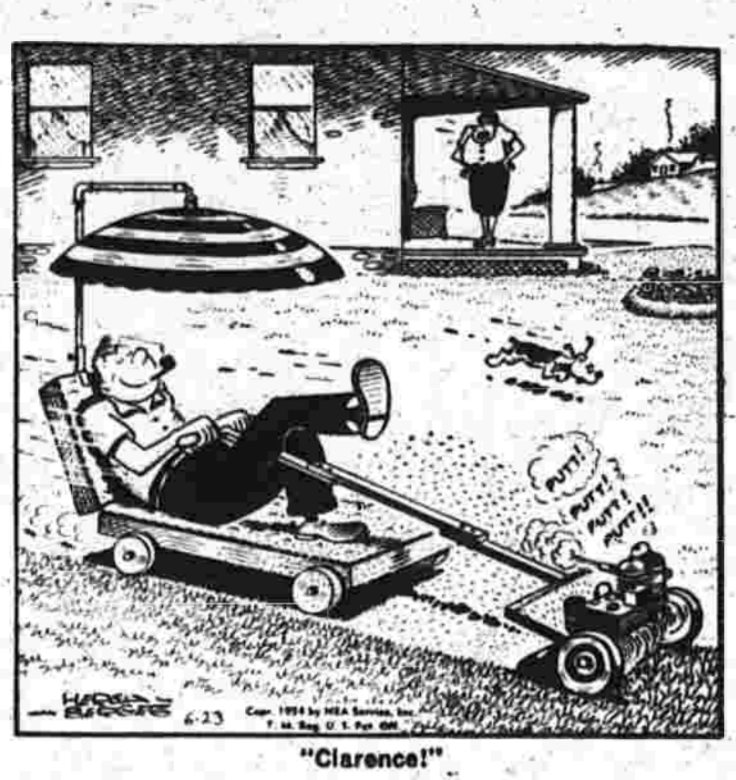

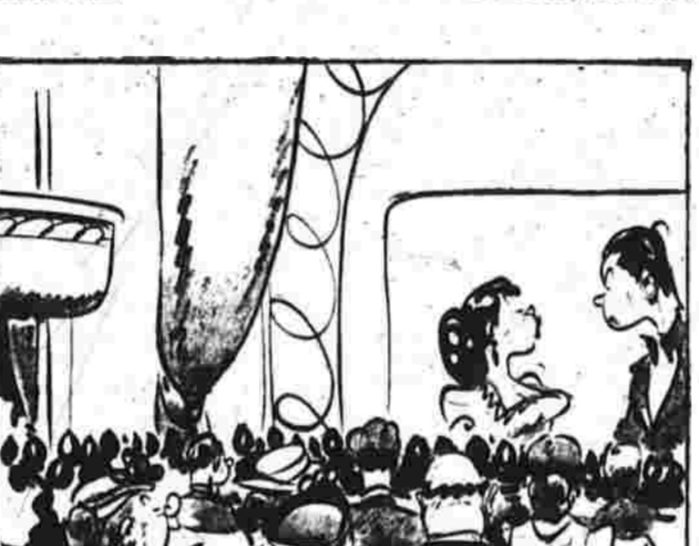
