"Let's see-which is larger, 1-3 or 1-4?" In the third grade children learn the value of fractional parts of a whole by using concrete materials which they can handle themselves, dividing them, and reassembling them. The terms used in relation to the use of fractions are part of the difficult vocabulary of arithmetic which children must learn and understand. Concrete materials help in the process.

Tying in geography with geometry helps impress mathematical processes on the minds of pupils. Children. measure the circumference of a globe to determine the relationship of circumference to diameter. Actually measurthe diameter checks the computation. And tying in the geographic information that the earth's circumference is 25,000 miles and its diameter is 8,000 tests the process.

The real test in fractions comes when you try to make 5-8 of a recipe. Eighth grade girls don't go to that extreme classes but they do learn how to cut a recipe in half and to measure ingredients accurate-Jy. They also learn the mathematics of saving time and materials, essentials for
