Washington, July 20 (AP)—East and West, with the United States standing aside, agreed today to partition Viet Nam roughly along the 17th parallel, a French source said. He reported only technical difficulties remained to be settled before signing of a cease-fire agreement for Indochina.

The partition line, it was said, will run about 12 miles north of the important Highway No. 9, leading from Quang Tri on the coastal road to Saigonshot in Laos.
