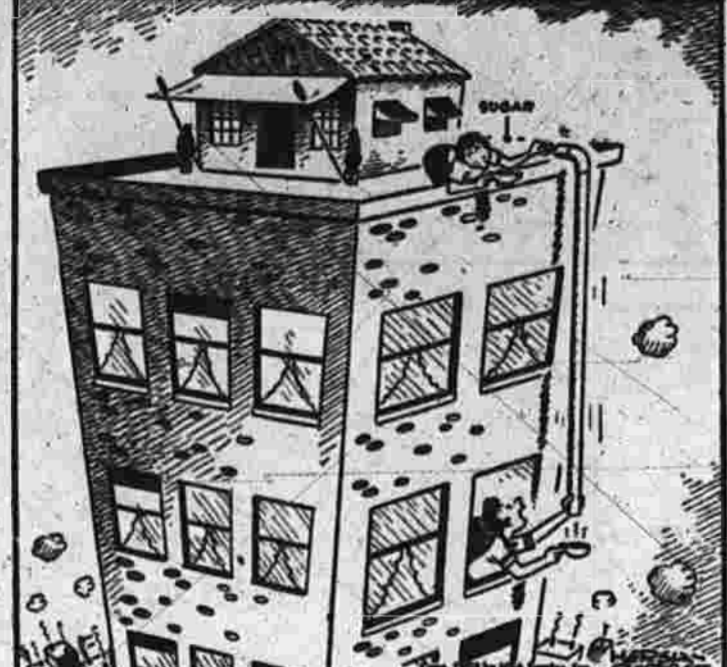
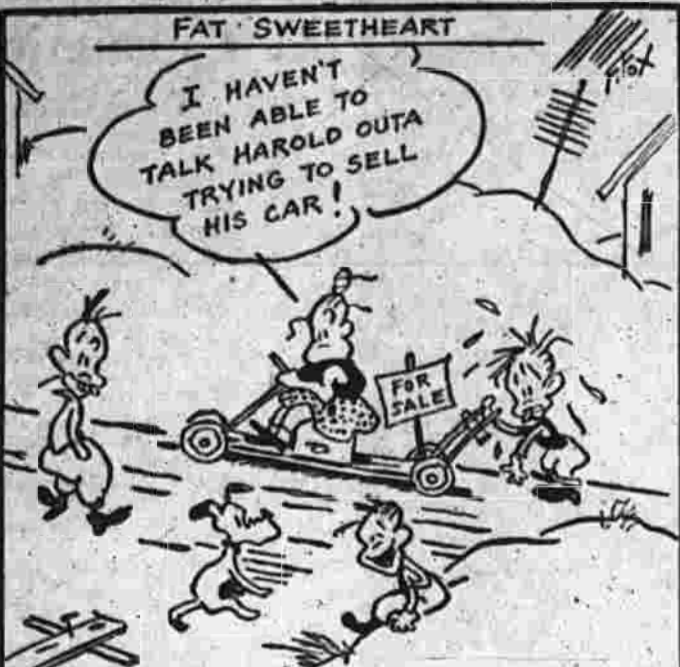

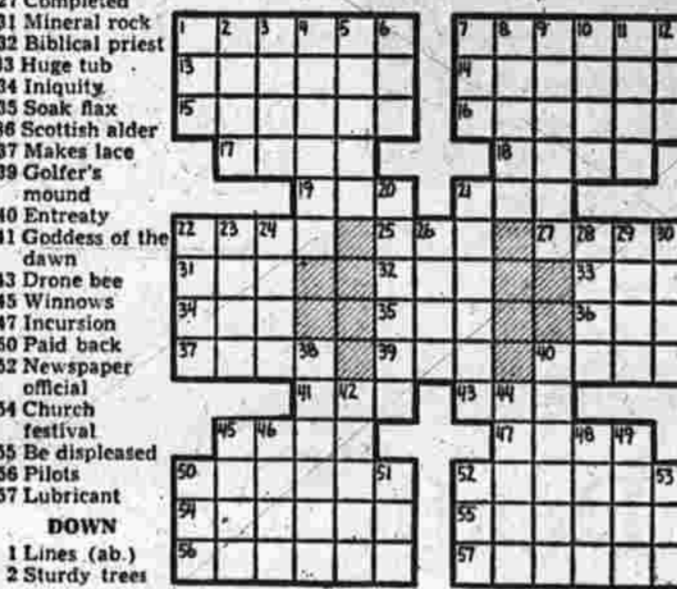

The International Union of Mine, Mill & Smelter Workers (IUMS) took the case to a Board of Arbitration, claiming the employer was not fired for proper and just cause. It said "Mr. D" should have been given a non-hazardous job. The union also said "Mr. D" discharged himself at least 12 years seniority and half his pension. The Board of Arbitration held that "Mr. D" was not unjustly discharged and ordered the company to make every effort to put the handicapped worker on a non-hazardous job. The company appealed the board's decision to the Superior Court and won. Then the union appealed to the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court, in a unanimous opinion written by Justice P. B. O'Sullivan, upheld the arbitration board's decision but said: "Whether 'Mr. D' will ultimately be entitled to reinstatement and back pay must await the result of future events. upheld a decision by Common Pleas Judge Raymond J. Devlin, who ruled that under collective bargaining agreements the company and the union (United Auto Workers—CIA), the pay rate for steam fitters and plumbers was not geared solely to the cost of materials and a maximum. The Supreme Court, in a unanimous opinion written by Chief Justice Roger A. Eggle, rejected the union's claim for damages by saying that the "going rates" were one of the factors in the job evaluation plan. He said wage increases for steam fitters and plumbers would throw the entire plan out of kilter. "To put it another way," he said, "the basic principle of the plan is that the rate of pay for a job is not in any way affected by the title attached to the job. It is determined by the rates of pay for the job level in which the job is placed, and that depends on the character of the work demanded of the job at that level.
