Showdown Should Be Staged
 Among the things awaiting the decision of France on the EDC is the final phrasing and the dispatch of a note to Moscow, Britain, France, and the United States.

This will be the note replying to the latest Russian proposal for a new conference on the problems of Europe. It will, in reality, be a reply to two notes: In their haste peace offensive following the Geneva Conference, the Russians sent us one note which somehow failed to cut much ice, either with western diplomats or with western public opinion. After the note flopped so visibly, the Russians tried again, sending a new note before the first one had been answered. The new note was not much more impressive, the main thing about it being its demonstration that the Russians were at least urgent about pressing their particular variety of peace offensive.

The drafting of a western reply has been virtually completed by representatives of France, Britain and the United States meeting in London. The final drafting will have to await the outcome of the French vote on EDC. But regardless of that outcome, the main tenor of the note has been set. It is described as a reply which is "not entirely negative."

That would seem to mean that, thanks to French and British diplomatic opinion, we have not closed the door on the possibility of a new conference on Europe, and that is good. It is good because it would be folly to let the current Communist peace offensive make so much noise for itself and indulge itself in so many caloric acts of relaxation of world tension without putting it to some realistic test, such as a new conference on Europe would provide.

If Russia really believes in coexistence, or if Russia is really willing to practice it for a time, then there is one way for Russia to prove this. And that is to come to some settlement with the West on the major problems still unresolved in Europe. These are the problems of a peace treaty for Germany, and of a peace treaty for Austria, and of the withdrawal of Russian troops from Central Europe these two things would logically involve.

At Geneva, Moscow, France and Anthony Eden succeeded in calling the Communist peace bluff. They succeeded in setting a stage on which the Communists either had to put up or shut up, in front of the whole world. The result was a peace in Indo-China which did no paper at least, including the concessions nobody really expected the Communists to make.

Perhaps the Communists did not expect to make them themselves. But they found themselves confronted with a showdown test, in which they either made peace, or gave up the privilege of posing as friends of peace.

One more similar showdown test should now be manufactured for the Russians in Europe. Here, too, they should be confronted with a sharply staged choice - either make some real contribution to the settlement of Europe's problems, or shut up all their peace talk.

It needs to be realized, on our side, that there would be just as much fear over any settlement in Europe as there has been over the apparent settlement in Indo-China. We would not believe that they had really given up their aim of dominating Europe, one part of us would consider any relaxation of tension a sure and a dangerous delusion. Trying to make peace is just as hard for us

 Apparently West Germany is having some problems the U.S.A. had in the Revolutionary War. Otto John and Schmitt-Wittmark remain the last vestige of eastern diplomacy have enough courage within itself to call the Russian bluff and bring the Russians clearly to the point at which they must either prove their peaceful intentions by acts, or give up whatever claim their "peace offensive" may have on the minds of men.

That Necessary Post Mortem
 There is an ominous whine of propaganda testimony and oratory designed to force upon the American mind full and final acceptance of certain theories about the war in Korea.
 The theories are these:
 1. We had full military victory within our grasp in Korea, and we were disappointed in the Truman administration, forbade our generals to take it.
 2. If Washington politicians weren't responsible for that cruel, disgraceful curb upon our troops, our treacherous allies may have been.
 3. Therefore, in any future armed conflict with Communism, it would be better if the United States were to go it alone. And in any case, the United States would go for full victory, for which there is no substitute.

The two latest exponents of these views are Senator Knowland, the Republican majority leader, who has told a California audience he will never again sign such nonsense as we had in Korea, and Lt. Gen. George H. Stratton, retired Air Force general, who told a Senate Intelligence Security subcommittee that "State Department and political infirmity kept us from winning the war."

General Stratton even carried his conviction of the theory that we were defeated, a victory which was ours into new ground by voicing the claim that General Atkinson's advance to the Yalu which resulted in one of the worst defeats ever suffered by American arms, was in reality a "masterstroke."

It is apparently the hope of the school of thought on this conviction represented in these two statements that, if these things are said often enough, the American people will believe and accept them, and, therefore, not only punish those American leaders and these "lies who were responsible for our policy in Korea, but also never again follow any course of policy like that we did follow in Korea.

These reiterated theories have a natural appeal to all those who think with their guts instead of with their heads. Somebody, therefore, ought to keep on making the answers. We went into Korea to fight World War III, not to fight it. We went into Korea under the United Nations flag because that was the only flag that could repel aggression without starting World War III.

Under that United Nations flag, we were not fighting Communism, but aggression. We were not fighting for conquest, but for the enforcement of a world law against aggression. Our objective, therefore, should have been peace rather than victory. Of the type of victory our blowhards say we should have obtained, two things must be said. One is that we were not in certain of it, then, as they are now. The other is that even if we had attained it, that would not have meant peace. This present day world, for that matter, is a world fresh from that kind of victory over Germany and Japan.

This United Nations action was the first instance in history in which a coalition of nations fought to preserve and enforce a world law. It set a precedent, and it demanded a new brand of thinking and of conduct. This new kind of thinking and this new kind of conduct are anathema to people who think only with their guts. To others, it is the first tangible sign of world progress toward peace and survival that has appeared in many centuries, and should be defended on that basis.

It is the same hope for the world's future for which a precedent was set in Korea, and which is now being smothered, from day to day, by good red-blooded people like Senator Knowland and General Clark, and General Stratton. They are entitled to their views, and the American people are entitled to some periodic restatement of the concept we did follow in Korea, and the concept we need to build and implement, rather than discard.
