Ellington Firemen to Vote On Disbandment

Billington, Aug. 30 (Sp.)—Members of the Crystal Lake Volunteer Fire Co. will hold their annual meeting tomorrow evening at 8 in the Crystal Lake Fire Dept. building.

At that time it is understood a resolution will be presented calling for disbandment of the department as of Jan. 1, 1955, and for liquidation of the land and buildings owned by the company.

Under the action proposed, the one truck now in service, with all its equipment, would be offered to the Center Volunteer Fire Dept. for use. New officers will be elected at the meeting.

The session will be open to only those members in good standing, and a full attendance is expected. It is understood that the volunteers number about 30 men.

The drastic action of the fire fighters stems from their dissatisfaction over the way the new Crystal Lake Fire District is being conducted, according to their spokesmen.

It will be recalled that at the annual district meeting in June, action was taken by 31 mill tax levied on the district, and the purchase by the commissioners of a new fire truck at a price not to exceed \$15,000.

A group of taxpayers signed a petition calling for another meeting approximately 10 days ago that they received this action as being against purchase of new equipment, and laid a two mill tax. As a result of this action, the tax collector of the district has collected about \$12,000 of the original rate.

"To date, no arrangement has been made to repay the overpayment of 1 1/2 mills. The newly elected district commissioners met Monday evening and elected Jack Tomlin as chairman and Paul Mancini, a commissioner, was named Fire Marshal.

The Fire District is starting its second year. The first tax laid was 1 1/2 mills and brought in over \$2,000 in taxes, with an operating budget of about \$1,500. The new rate recently levied will bring in approximately \$2,400 on a grand total of about \$12,000.

"Of this, about \$1,700 is allocated for expenses of the department. The remainder of the payment for the tax rate reduction is to be used to put aside to add new equipment.

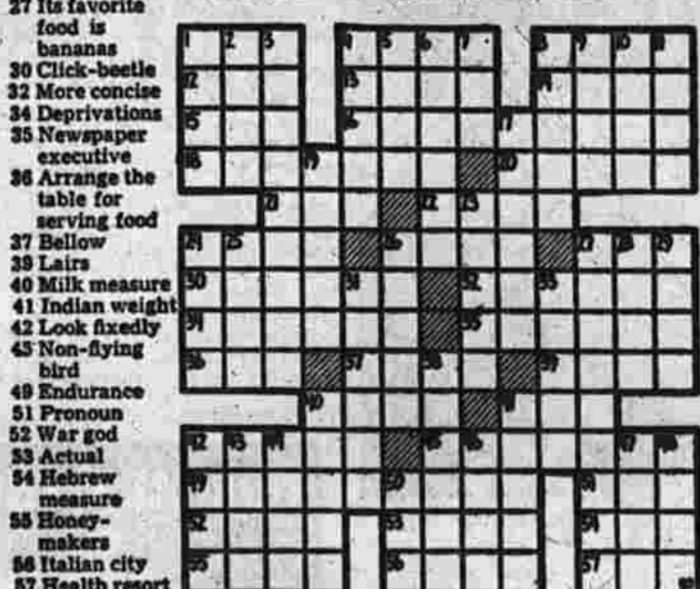

Mart Operating Five Day Week

Because of an unusually large crop of tomatoes this season, the Manchester Auction Mart will be open five days this week, auction officials announced today. Opening the week yesterday, the mart will continue through Thursday, beginning at 2 p. m. each day. Friday and Saturday will be the off days. The mart began its full auction last week, operating three days. Receipts for the first week totaled \$5,782.35. There were 2,132 half-bushel baskets of tomatoes sold, bringing an average of \$2.50 for the grade. In addition to tomatoes, 175 bushels of cucumbers, 100 bushels of small beans, 57 crates of early cauliflower and 66 half-bushel baskets of pears were sold at the mart during the opening week. Sales yesterday totaled \$1,758.95. There were 1,085 one-half bushel baskets of tomatoes offered. Of these, 706 were grade one. The grade one price averaged \$1.80 per half bushel with a high of \$1.80 and a low of \$1. There were also 65 bushels of cucumbers offered, bringing a high of \$1.70 and a low of \$1.20. Small beans brought a high of \$2.30 and a low of \$2.10. The tomatoes are making their first appearance in their new trademarked wrapper, bearing the name and location of the Manchester Mart.

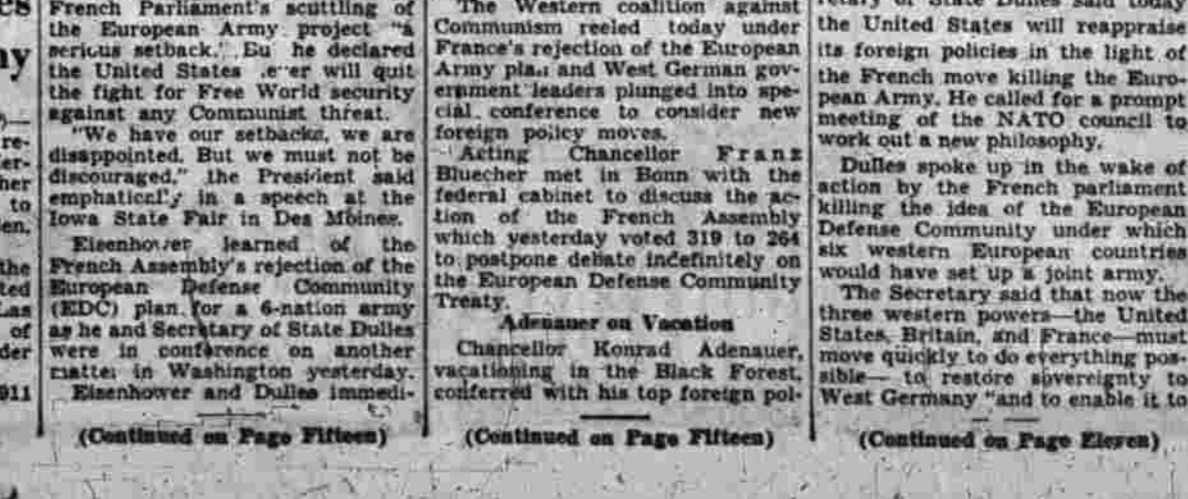
