### Anti-Polio Vaccine Is Given to 1,632

Pittman, N. J., Sept. 20 (UP)—Churches, police and civic organizations pledged in yesterday to help health authorities inoculate 1,632 children and expectant mothers in this southern New Jersey community with gamma globulin.

The mass inoculation was opened Saturday night after four cases of polio were reported with in a week. Seven doctors and five dentists, assisted by 25 registered nurses, completed the job in a little more than seven hours.

A group of 300 hastily mobilized volunteers aided in the operation. Veterans organizations aided in setting up emergency centers in two town schools and distributing leaflets advising the people of the inoculations. The clergy also helped with the word at church services.

The serum was provided by the New Jersey Department of Health and brought from Trenton Saturday night.

Harold Down, president of Pittman's Board of Health, said practically all of the boys and girls of pre-school age and pupils in the first five grades had been inoculated. Many expectant mothers and a group of classmates of one of the older youths stricken with polio also were inoculated.
