





London, Sept. 25 (/P)-In-formed diplomats here say J. S. Secretary of State Dulles is carrying to London tonight a warning that France can't count on U. troops remaining in Europe i Paris blocks Allied attempts to rearm West Germany.

Dulles is due here tomorrow fo a conference on German rearma ment with the Foreign Ministers of France, West Germany, Italy, Bel-gium, the Netherlands, Luxem-bourg, Britain and Canada. The informants said if France's Premier Mendes-France goes along
