Grandmother's Scrapbook Aid to Church Historian

Manchester, in its history, produced one governor—the state of Colorado.

Early Manchester had a law providing that "very person in this town shall be obliged in the month of March; April and May to kill one dozen blackbirds or one pay one shilling to the town, and any person who shall kill more than their dozen head shall be allowed one penny per head that they shall kill."

Manchester first appeared on a printed map as "Union Village," in 1775. Manchester history, as it is found in a scrapbook which is to be on display at Center Congregational Church tomorrow as the church opens a special historical exhibit in connection with its 175th anniversary.

The scrapbook in question was compiled by the late Mrs. Cheney House, grandmother of Emily House Malmden, who held the assignment as church historian for the anniversary celebration. Mrs. Malmden's history of the church, an attractive booklet, is available to church members and to the public.

The House scrapbook seems to contain all the facts ever recorded about Manchester and its people, from the time of its settlement by a Manxman who had gone west for his health, who served as the ninth governor of Colorado, from 1876 to 1883.

Guards to Picket Prison in Indiana

Michigan City, Ind., Oct. 5.—(Special)—Guards will strike from the big grey Indiana State Prison "Friday" and set up pickets in the face of an "instant-diminished" strike, a union official today said.

Richard Griffith, vice president of the International Guards Union said that 100 of the prison's 187 guards agreed yesterday to stage the strike. He emphasized, however, that if guards would be left in the prison to maintain inner security.

"There will be no strike at the Indiana Reformatory at Pendleton, Griffith said. There had been some question over this since his statement last week that reformatory guards would follow prison guards in any decision.

The guards seek a 40-hour work week, correction of "unfair work conditions" and rehiring of four guards the union charged were fired for union activity, Griffith said.

"Meanwhile, National Guards units were alerted and state police shifted to provide ready security forces for the big prison, which houses 2,774 inmates.

Warden J. Ellis Overland said he didn't think that the strike would "amount to anything." But he said that he had more than enough personnel, including supervisors and non-union employees, to maintain a guard force without outside help.

Overland denied that the four guards recently discharged had been fired because of union organizing. He said all had proved unsatisfactory in their work. He didn't elaborate.

High O'Brien, state correction chairman, said yesterday that any guard who struck would be fired immediately.

Overland said that he had spoken to every man on the guard roster and each had fully understood he would be fired should he join his post.

Wing Describes Social Security

A provision in the new social security law recently enacted by Congress will help preserve the old-age and survivors insurance rights of those totally disabled for prolonged periods. Charles W. Wing, manager of the Hartford social security office, said this week.

"It does this by freezing their work records as of the date they become disabled. It does not, however, provide any payments before retirement age of death," Wing said.

If in January 1955, a person has been totally disabled for work for six months or more, he may apply for this freezing of his social security record. He must, however, have worked for the required length of time under social security and have a disability which is expected to continue indefinitely. Although no application can be accepted before January 1, 1955, it may at that time cover a disability which began several years before Wing said.

Persons wishing further information may secure a free booklet, "Facts for Those Who Are Disabled," from their social security office.

"They include a four cents an hour across the board pay increase, a maximum pension of \$52.50 a month after 30 years' service, described by Doherty as the first pension plan of its kind in the brass industry, and improvement in sickness and hospitalization insurance."

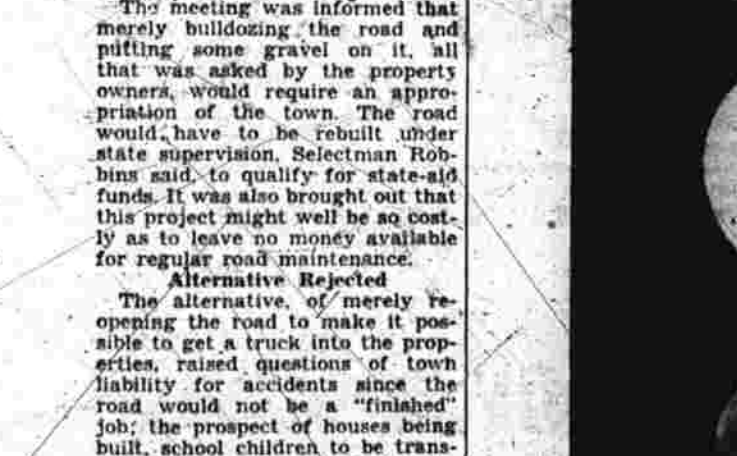

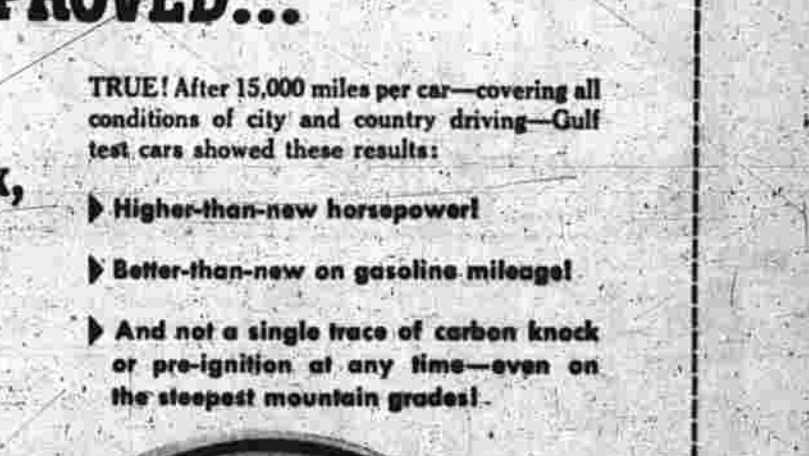
