

The same thin margin sent about 15 Democrats to the House. Without Eisenhower's name at the top of the ballot, Democrata contend, most of the "marginal" Republicans who won in 1952 will lose this year, while "marginal" Democrats will have less trouble han they did two years ago. Depending on whom you are talking to, the actual number of

"marginal" seats varies. Repub-licans list 50 GOP and 42 Demo-crats in that category. Demo-crats rate 40 Republican and 45 Democratic districts as "mar Both Predict Victories Republican analysts publicly say they will lore none of their "marginal" holdings and will gain from 19 to 20 seats from the mocrats.

Democrats say they have a chance to pick up as many as 68 Republican seats while losing not more than 10 of their own.

HAMILTON STANDARD EQUIPS NEW CONSTELLATION-FASTEST PROPELLER-DRIVEN TRANSPORT

A new Navy Super Constellation transport plane provides another example of superior aircraft performance now possible with advanced Hamilton Standard equipment. This new Lockheed aircraft can cruise at 440 m.p.h.-nearly 100 m.p.h. faster than any commercial transport now flying. It is driven by four Turbo-Hydromatic propellers, each 15 feet in diameter with blades 2 feet wide. These giant Hamilton Standard propellers harness 22,000 h.p. from four T-34 turboprop engines. The new plane, designated R7V-2 by the Navy, made its naiden flight in August and is still in test status. It is able to fly 16-ton loads coast-to-coast in under 6 hours, or New York to London in less

than 9 hours. Air Force models will be called C-121Fs.







Earliest Possible Attention Should Be Given to Stuttering By EDWIN P. JORDAN, M.D. Written for NEA Service

About one or two out of every e hundred persons has a speech defect known as stuttering. This always begins early in childhood and is about four times as com-mon among boys as among girls. It is not restricted to any level of society and afflicts the poor as much as the rich. Essentially stut-tering is a disturbance in the rhythm of speech. There are spasms of repeating sounds or blocking of the speech sounds for a few moments.

There are several theories to what causes stuttering, but i certainly seems to be a nervous of emotional disorder. Boston, Oct. 14 (P)-The U. S. Weather Bureau said today the situation Hurricane Hazel poses for New England is one that "will bear careful watching." The bureau expected the hurricane which swept up the tropics leaving a trail of death and damage would be in the Cape Hatteras area to-night which "makes it quite critical for New England."

Miami, Fla., Oct. 14 (AP)-Hurricane Hazel-a rejuvenater monster packing 130-mile-an-hour winds-whirled toward the North Carolina coast at increased speed today and hurricane warnings were raised over the North Carolina Cape area.

The Weather bureau predicted the storm, now the most violent among the eight Atlantic hurricanes of this year. would strike the coast early tomorrow in the Cape Hatteras
