Schereschewsky said that mere identification of the fear is half the battle in overcoming it, that sympathy should be given and it should be demonstrated to the child that the fear is groundless. He listed and was quite specific about the symptoms of some of the fears much to the delight of his audience. Included were those concerning physical features of facial characteristics, height, weight and muscular coordination; of not going to heaven or going to hell, the fear of God which he deplored, fear of death, of fire, of kidnaping and that the world would come to an end.

"We parents," the speaker continued, "should understand that we are coping with normal children and this fact throws us of base. We expect too much and the fact children persist in acting like children baffles us."

He pointed out children have three different ages simultaneously, the intellectual, chronological and emotional; that it seldom happens all three are the same and only one grows at a time while the others apparently remain in abev-

arce. He also said it was quite normal for children to swing from one parent to another during the growth period, preferring at some time to take guidance from one and at other times, the opposite parent.

Help Children

He was quite specific in what he conceives to be the job of parents, "to help our children to learn to be independent of us." He said that is what all parents really want is what all parents really want. He said parents must first meet the child's psychological needs, to teach him there are absolutes of justice, honesty, mercy and love to teach him a sense of persona responsibility.

He said parents must present a united front in discipline which he defined as training and further defined negative discipline as punishment and positive discipline as indoctrination of ideals.

Indoctrination of ideals.

To make another point, Schereschewsky cited the much used statement that our courts are full of juvenile delinquents because there is so much divorce. He attacked the statement by saying the thinking does not go far enough. "It's not the divorce or the separation but rather the constant enough. "It's not the divorce or the separation but rather the constant friction, bloodletting, nagging and harpooning which is bad" and said recent studies had revealed it is this type of home which is the prime cause of mental disturbance in college students.

Beyond the four physical needs common to civilization, food, clothing, shelter and tools, the speaker said children need security, affection and heroes. He said a child's feeling of security is a reflection of the parents calmness, confidence and courage in meeting the routine problems of living. The hero, he continued is the yardstick by which your child measures rightness or wrongness in his own behavior and he has dozens of heroes. He said the problem of helping a child to feel necessary is one of our urban civilization. The farm kid of past generations, he said, may not have liked getting up early to do chores before he went to school but he knew every day that he was necessary. He recommended listing all jobs children might do with regularity, necessary work not "made" work, and assigning them in the family.

New York, Oct. 14 (P)-Th New York Times said today that a second extensive investigation of the government's intelligence or the government's intelligence activities is now in progress in Washington and elsewhere.

The Times said one of the investigations — never announced publicly—is headed by Air Force Lt. Gen. James H. Doolittle (Ret.) Doolittle's group, the story added, is charged with investigating the secret operations of the Central Intelligence Agency, and was authorized by the White House.

The other investigation already The other investigation, already announced, is that of the Hoover Commission Task Force on Intelligence Activities headed by Gen. Mark W. Clark (Pet.). Storm's Fury Ike Speaks Tonight on To Skip State Farm Plan
