### Bolton CD Director Avery Alerts Town for Hazel's Arrival

Bolton, Oct. 15 (Special)—Chief of Defense Director John D. Avery advised local residents last night to keep their radios on constantly during the present hurricane season. He stressed it was most important the radio be tuned to a Connecticut station to get adequate warning of the situation for this area.

The State CD has a leased teletype machine at the U. S. Weather Station at Bradley Field. Avery reported, through which they will keep in constant contact with Connecticut radio stations. Should a storm warning come, CD personnel in all 108 towers will be alerted by the telephone fan-out system and will be advised to turn on radios for further instructions. The radio receiver on the fire equipment will be manned constantly during the alert.

The local level will be used to alert the public if the warning should come during the night. The signal used will be the "all-clear" consisting of three separate blasts at spaced intervals. If it is felt necessary, police and fire trucks may tour the various areas using their sirens to alert people to turn on their personal radios.

Avery feels it is important people realize that sirens during this emergency may mean "turn on your radio" and not indicate the fire department is out on a call to extinguish a blaze.

Other problems include maintaining a suitable ice surface and providing for snow removal. Since such a risk would be available to all parents and children alike, Avery anticipates that there may be some volunteer help in this regard.

### Scientists Split Over Ill Effects Of Cigarettes

New Haven, Oct. 15 (AP)—It is too premature to tell people to stop smoking because of claims that cigarettes have increased the death rate due to lung cancer?

Dr. R. C. Cuyler Hammond, the Yale scientist who maintains cigarettes do cause lung cancer, says he has two choices:

1. Stop smoking on the assumption that cigarettes cause lung cancer.
2. He can wait until some future time to make up his mind.

Companies Only Lose

If he stops smoking, cigarette companies lose money, Hammond said. "However, at the same time this would clear the mental decks for an intensive research program to develop safe cigarettes, if the assumption is correct, then many lives would be saved."

If the smoker decides to wait it out, "the cigarette companies would continue to make profits and people would continue to enjoy smoking," he said. "The penalty for being wrong in this decision... would be the loss of thousands of human lives."

"Look at the balance," Hammond said. "In one pan lie human lives. In the other pan lie profit and pleasure."

"Considering these facts," he said, "and considering the weight of the evidence relating to lung cancer, is it premature to make a positive decision at this time?"

### Hal Boyle An Old Indian Athlete Teaches Tolerance

New York (AP)—Louis Tewainima, a wrinkled Hopi tribesman who in his youth was one of America's greatest distance runners, has decided to do something to help the world that blow across the seas every day.

"Too many no-Indians here," explained the octogenarian runner, "after two days of sightseeing amid Yankettan's tall skyscrapers."

Tewainima, 82, is a Hopi from the outside world would let them for more than 1,000 years.

"This was his first visit here in 42 years. Since he returned to the 20,000 meter race in the 1912 Olympics at Stockholm—at about the age of 40. It was one of only three times in his career he failed to win."

Recently he was named a member of the all-time U.S. Olympic track and field team in a poll conducted by the Helms Athletic Foundation. He came here to attend a fund-raising dinner for the 1956 Olympic team last July. A fellow was quite touched, he said, to be remembered after all these years.

Running is natural to him, as it is to all Hopi Indians. Through an interpreter, he speaks halting English—82-year-old Tewainima explained:

"It is part of our religion. The body is our temple, and we must keep it well."

As a boy Louis, who is now a high school Hopi priest, trained by running to catch jackrabbits, wild horses and antelope. He ran them down on foot.

"Catch jackrabbit in few minutes," he said gravely. "Antelope take half a day. Not so long to catch horse. Horse get tired."

To prove he had reached manhood and was entitled to become head of a family, Tewainima ran 150 miles in a day at the shuttling loop, peculiar to his tribe.

"If no run fast," he said, "can run for long time."

Tewainima can still travel 10 to 20 miles a day easily. He takes care of his own herd of 100 sheep and tills his own garden. Here is his recipe for living long and staying healthy:

"Eat good, keep sheep... keep garden."

Here is his reaction to some of the tourist mecca of the world's greatest city:

"Broadway—just enough grass for sheep... Just for pigeons. Times Square at night—"Never no dark."

"The subway—"Ugh!"

The view from the Empire State building—"Make other houses look little."

After climbing the steps inside the Statue of Liberty—"It's a big woman!"

Asked what he thought about the atom bomb, Tewainima looked puzzled, then asked with complete dignity:

"What that mean?"

"To that question what answer can anyone give? Who know?"

of life in Haiti Tuesday, struck the U. S. coastline a severe blow, but lowering waves caused more damage along the coast than wind. The Miami weather bureau, hurricane forecasting headquarters, reported that the storm center crossed the coastline a short distance east of Myrtle Beach at 11:15 a. m.

Chills to hurricane force winds and extremely heavy rains will continue especially to the north and east of the center as the hurricane progresses southward across North Carolina and into Virginia during the day, the advisory said.

All precautions should be continued against dangerous winds and abnormally high tides in the North Carolina coast and northward until the hurricane passes.

Thousands of beach homes were torn up and many homes and commercial stands washed away.

Associated Press photographer Rudy Falcioli reported from Myrtle Beach watching a virtually undamaged home with attached garage float majestically toward sea, its weather vanes proudly turning.

Tide Above Normal  
Dr. Waldo H. Jones, hurricane warning officer at Myrtle Beach, estimated winds there at 100 to 120 miles an hour. At this time were 9 to 11 feet above normal.

Non-Catholics, Wilmington Star-News photographer, reported seeing the 40-room, four-story brick hotel at Carolina Beach, south of Wilmington, collapsed after winds hit it from its roof. No one was reported hurt.
