## Hurricane Hazel Crashes North Carolina, Roars into Virginia; Damage in Millions

# Storm's Fury Ike Speaks Tonight on To Skip State Farm Plan

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS suchusetts, New Hampshire and New England may miss the full fury of Hurricane Hazel but can expect gale winds up to 75 miles an hour, abnormally high tides and torrential rains, the weather bureau said at noon today.

Hazel moved inland this morning at Myrtie Beach, S. C., and was expected to follow a northerly course through North Carolina, Virginia, Pennsylvania and New York State toward Canada.

The forecarter at Boston said the extreme winds of 100 miles an hour will diminish somewhat as the storm moves up the coast and that all New England will get heavy rain with onshore winds and gales.

It was suggested occupants of low lying coastal areas might find it necessary to evacuate this afternoon before the storm hits.

Norfolk, Va., Oct. 15 (P)—Hurricane Hazel's center probably will pass "a little to the west of Richmond during the late afternoon," the Norfolk Weather Bureau predicted at I p.m. today.

The bureau had reported at noon the hurricane would pass between Richmond and Norfolk at 6:30 p.m. but revised its forecast on the basis of later information,

Wilmington, N. C., Oct. 15 (A)-Hurricane Hazel, still packing winds of 100 miles an hour, smashed its way northward through eastern North Carolina today after wreaking havoc along 120 miles of the Carolinas' coastline. There were no immediate reports of serious casualties among the well-warned residents of the coast. Most of them sought safer quarters. A few minor injuries were reporter

Property damage ran into millions of dollars as the storm tore up coastal installations, washed away houses and snarled communications. Heaviest damage was caused by towering waves generated by the windstorm. It was moving north at about 27 miles an hour and the weather

bureau said it gradually would lose force as it moved over the land across North Carolina, Virginia and into the North Atlantic States.

Formosa can't be self supporting while maintaining a haif million man army, but it is making progress and getting by on fewer U. S. dollars each year.

V. Sh.De Beausset, project manager of the J. G. White Engineering Corp., says economic progress in some fields has been sensational since 1949, when the Nationalists were driven from the mainland.

League Launches

Drive for Funds

The sixth annual finence drive of the League of Women Voters of Manchester got underway Tuerday evening when a kickoff meeting for workers was held at the Princeton Street home of Mrs. Frank Horton, finance chairman, Mrs. Jay Rubinow of Pitkin Street, a member of the State League Board, was guest speaker and emphasized that the purpose of the drive is to solicit non-member contributions from those public spirited citizens who believe that an investment in the work of the league is an aid to promoting understanding of good covernment. She stated that a survey found that with improved methods and plant varieties, the same amount of sugar could be produced on half the land. The government accepted the recommendations and now Formosa is almost self sufficient as to food. It can even export rice.

The amount of land used for sugar production—454,200 acres—was cut in half. The other half is planted to rice, peanuts and sweet potatoes.

## An Old Indian Athlete Teaches Tolerance

New York (7)—Louis Tewanima, a wrinkled Hopi tribesman who in his youth was one of America's greatest distance runners, has decided he doesn't want to live in New York.

"Too many no-Indians here," explained the octogenarian racer, after two days of sightseeing amid Kanhaitan's tall ctone tepees.

Tewanima prefers the mighty messas of Arisona, where his people have dwelt as peacefully as the outside world would let them for more than 1,000 years.

This was his first visit here in 42 years, since he returned to the reservation after placing second in the 10,000 meter race in the 1912 Olympica at Stockholm—at about the age of 40. It was one of only three races in his career he failed to win.

Recently he was named a member of the all-time U.S. Olympic track and field team in a poll conducted by the Helms Athle Foundation. He came here to 1956 Olympic team, and the remembered after all these years.
Running is natural to him, as it
is to all Hopi Indians. Through interpreter—he speaks halting English — 82-year-old Tewanima "It is part of our religion. The body is our temple, and we must keep it weil."

As a boy Louis, who is now a high-ranking Hopi priest, trained by running to earth jackrabbits, wild horses and antelopes. He ran them down on foot. "Catch jackrabbit in few minlong to catch horse. Horse get To prove he had reached manhood and was entitled to become 150 miles in a day at the shuffling lope peculiar to his tribe.
"If no run fast," he said, "can
run for long time." Tewanima can still travel 10 to 20 miles a day easily. He takes care of his own herd of 100 sheep and tills his own garden. Here

That's the opinion today of Motor Vehicles Commissioner Charles F. Kelley. He said that many school bus safety laws are hampered because of the venture of the venture of the said that the said that many school bus safety laws are hampered because of the venture of the said that the sa said. "That often makes it difficult for motorists to spot a school bus easily, and to drive accordingly."

The Motor Vehicles chief said that these buses "should be standardized." painted yellow and plainly marked. He said there should also be a standard test for drivers.

Not only should school buses be plainly marked, he said, they should be used exclusively for transporting pupils to and from

should be used exclusively for transporting pupils to and from school. To use these vehicles for other purposes, he added, only confuses the motorists.

Manchester uses 11 buses to transport its school children, and all of them are contracted for by the Board of Education, Douglas Pierce, business agent for the School Board, said four buses, which are rented from Elmer Thrail, are of the standard, yellow painted type, generally used to carry school children. The others are owned by the Silver Lane Bus Co, and are the same vehicles used on the company's regular commercial runs.



**Mountains Fail** To Halt Storm

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS Hurricane Hazel, with a deadly swipe at eight states, the District of Columbia and Canada, yesterday left a death toll of at least 68, countless injured and untold millions of dollars

n property damage.

Termed one of the worst continental storms of the Century and spawned 11 days ago in the Windward Islands about .600 miles east-southeast of Miami, Hazel's 130-mile-annour center devastated the island of Haiti last Tuesday, leavng reportedly more than 100 dead on that tropic isle. She smashed north northwest to bash the U.S. mainland early yesterday. Her hurricane winds were "calmed" to gale force by Pennsylvania's Allegheny and Pocono Mountainsbut she picked up enough punch to disrupt upper New York State and take 13 lives in the area,

New York 13, Virginia 7, Pennsylvania 11, North Carolina 10, Maryland 6, New Jersey 5, Delaware 4, Washington, D. C., 3, Massachusetts 1, Connecticut 1, and Canada 7, Hazel isn't "dead," the New York Weather Bureau said early today, the big blow was merging with a Hudson Bay storm.

Although her outer winds merely "brushed" the New England
area, Hazel's sprawting might
still was making itself felt early
today, with the coastal regions
girding against the threat of abnormally high tides.

At an early hour, storm warnings still were being flown from
Block Island (off Rhode Island) to
Eastport, Maine.
