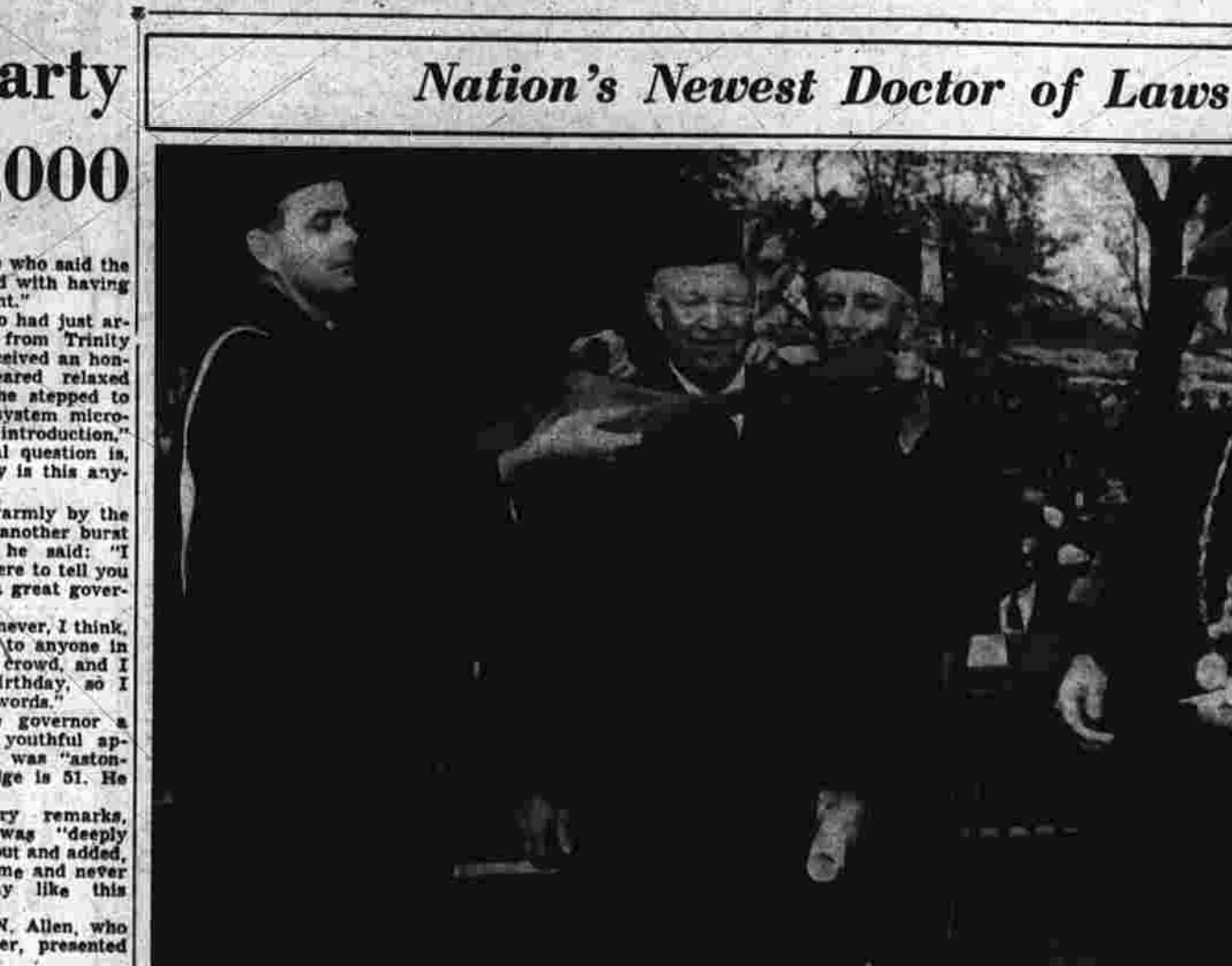

Ives said enormous sums of money were found in a bank account in the name of a clerk in Vaue's office and that R. H. Robinson, president of the steamship line, admitted knowing that Vaue had been paid to get the leases.

"Now what did Harriman have to say about all this?" asked Ives. "He blundered around in the face and said he knew nothing whatsoever about it."

Harriman, apparently having the newspaper files in mind, told newsmen about an hour after the Ives telecast.

"Tonight's papers quote my opinion as saying: 'I never fight so hard as when my back is to the wall. What he meant was that he plays fair only when he is ahead.'"

Harriman said Ives abandoned a promise to discuss issues and dug back into newspaper files of almost 15 years ago to rehash a matter, widely publicized at that time, involving the leasing of piers to a shipping company with which Ives was connected.

"When this matter was first brought up, I appeared before a federal grand jury. I stated under oath that I had no knowledge of the payments that were said to have been paid to Judge Vaue. That was the truth."

maxed by the successful conclusion of the recent nine nation talks here on German rearmament and European defense.

Prime Minister Churchill was made a Knight of the Garter on April 24, 1953.

For both Eden and Churchill this is the highest honor they could receive and still remain in the House of Commons. A peerage would automatically put them into the House of Lords.

The Garter is regarded as a signal honor and sign of the sovereign's approval.

Eden, 57, viewed as Prime Minister Churchill's most likely successor, has been a conservative member of Parliament since 1923.

He divorced his first wife and in August, 1952, married Mrs. Clara Spencer Churchill, a niece of the Prime Minister.

The announcement from Buckingham Palace said:

"The Rt. Hon. Anthony Eden, M.P., secretary of state for foreign affairs, in audience this morning before he left for Paris. During the audience her majesty conferred upon him the honor of knighthood and invested him with the insignia of a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter."

Bay State Fliers Killed in Crash

Granville, Mass., Oct. 20 (AP)—Two Massachusetts National Guard aviators were killed last night when their jet plane crashed in flames.

John Collier, an eyewitness, said the plane roared over his house in flames with the pilot apparently veering the plane intentionally into woods to avoid hitting homes.

The plane crashed in the woods two miles from the center of the town. It plowed a furrow 125 feet long and about 12 feet deep and set about two acres of woodland ablaze. The fire was quickly extinguished.

The victims were identified as Lt. Richard G. Brown, 38, of Northampton, son of two and a veteran of World War II, and T. Sgt. Austin A. Cooper, 28, of West Springfield.

The plane was attached to the 131st Fighter Squadron, stationed at Barnes Airport, Westfield.

Hal Boyle La Rosa Now Goes To Godfrey's Tailor

New York (AP)—A year ago to movie Arthur Godfrey fired singer Julius La Rosa, the first man ever to lose his job on a television screen in full view of millions.

The incident quickly blew up the biggest tempest in video's brief history.

Startled by the storm he had created, the red-haired king of TV performers sorrowfully explained why he had dismissed La Rosa, the young New York veteran whose career he had launched. His reason: "Julie" lacked what Godfrey called "for lack of a better word—"humility."

The explanation merely fanned the controversy. Humility? What was humility? A nation wondered whether Arthur himself had any course records in humility.

He had built a house for his Broadway Casandra—a network executive, too—and his protégé would be hurt badly by their public airing of private differences. They figured Arthur would make a fast buck out of the notoriety, then disappear from show business.

He hasn't worked out that way at all. Both Arthur and Julie have survived the parting, and time has even smoothed the scars of a few CBS vice presidents.

What kind of year has it been for the two principals? Well, Godfrey lost and regained his air pilot's license. Financially, he didn't do as well as General Motors, but seems in no danger of having to sell apples on street corners.

La Rosa, on the other hand, has earned \$300,000, more than 10 times the \$30,000 a year he was making with Godfrey. The money came from recordings, TV guest appearances and a nationwide night club and theater tour.

Julie averages about \$1,500 a week for night club engagements, \$5,000 for one night stands and pulled down \$43,000 for two weeks at the Chicago theater, where he had a percentage deal.

I reached La Rosa by phone during a stopover at the Chicago airport the other day and asked him how he felt about Godfrey.

"I realize that if it weren't for him, I wouldn't be where I am," he said. "But I can't tell toward him as I did before. But I am honestly grateful to him."

"No, I can't say I like him. But I don't dislike him either. I'm just grateful to him."

Does La Rosa now feel he has learned humility?
"Well, I've made quite a study of that word during the last year," said Julie. "and what it really means. I've read what Thomas Aquinas, St. Augustine, and Bishop Sheen, and other philosophers have said about it."

"You know it doesn't mean what most people think it does. Humility doesn't consist in just being nice
