Foreign ministers of these nine countries virtually completed the task of rewriting the 1948 Treaty of Brussels to add West Germany and Italy to the original five nations. They reached their decisions in the Palais de Chaillot, Paris, late last night after the American, French and West German ministers agreed on terms to end the Allied occupation of West Germany and restore, with a few exceptions, complete sovereignty to West Germany.

The foreign ministers of the United States, Britain and France took the action this afternoon in a brief session with West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer. The four statesmen put the finishing touches on a series of documents which will be signed today. These documents set forth the details of the new union, which will be completed by the end of the year.

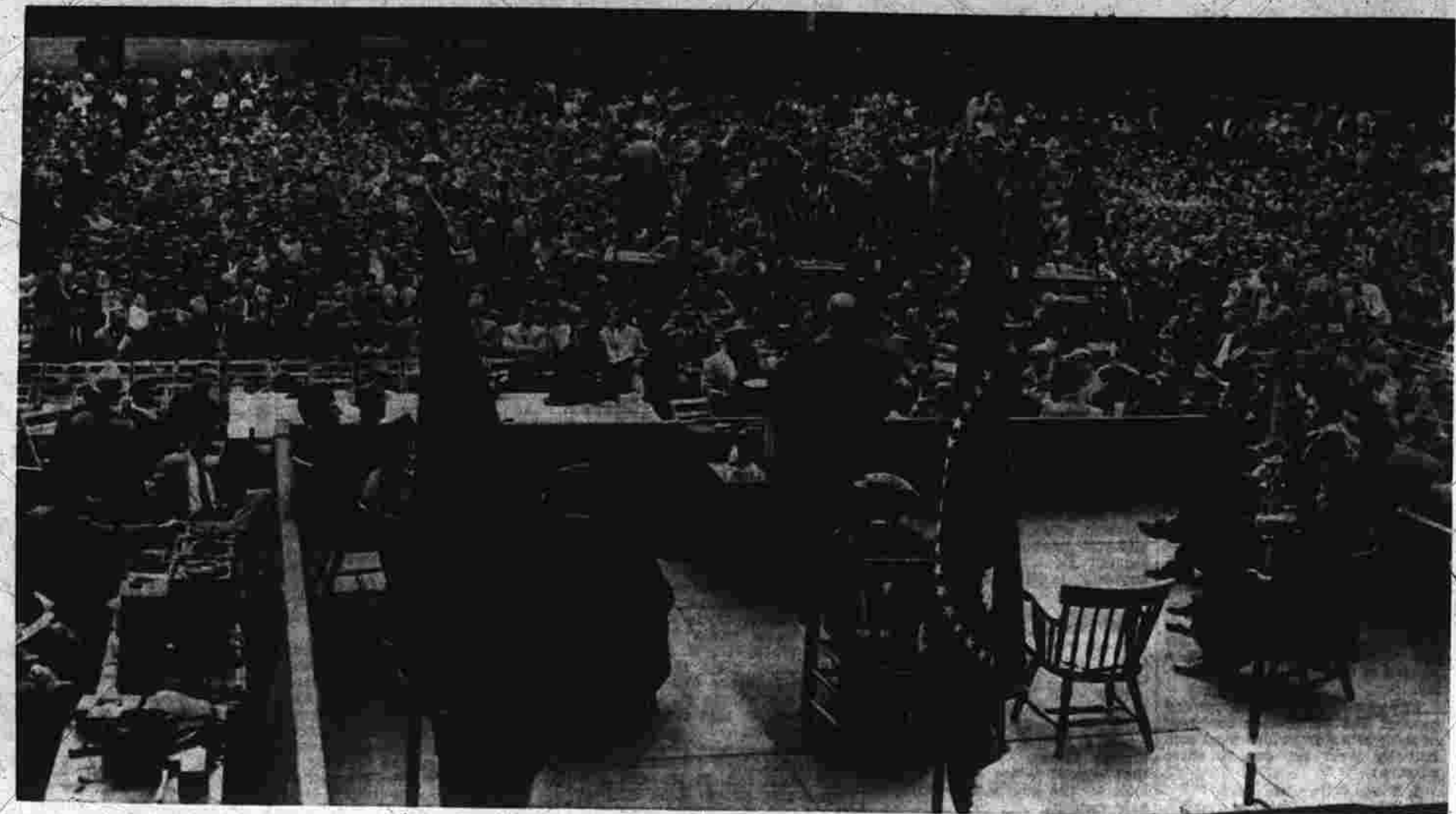

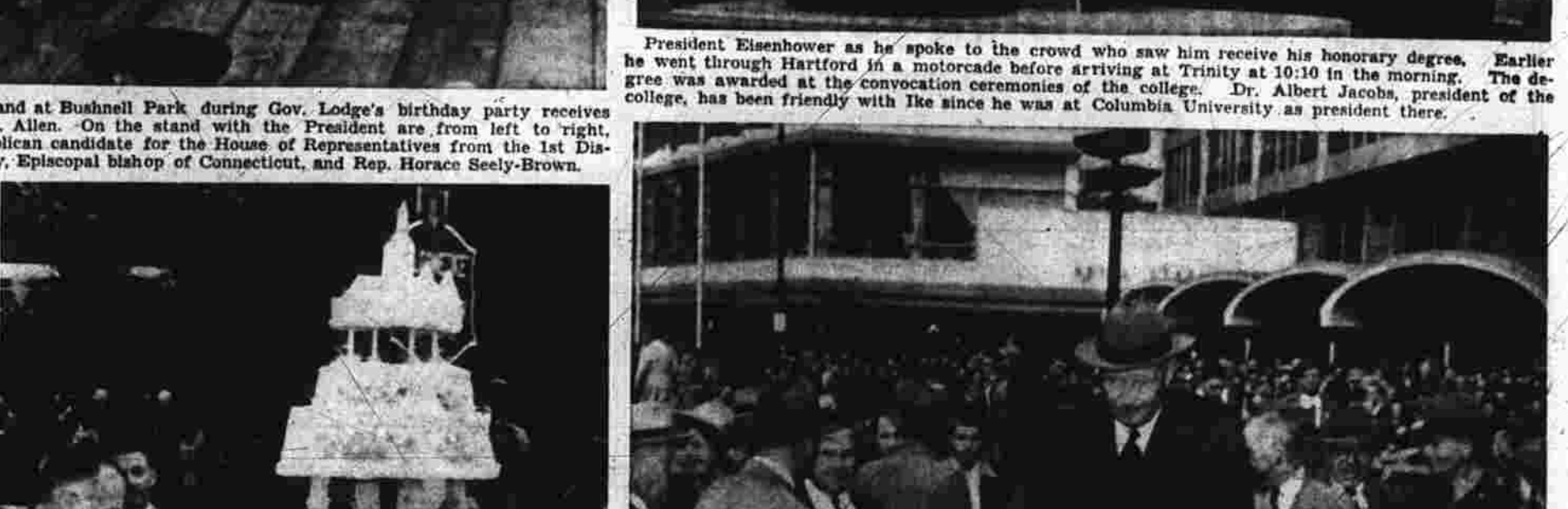

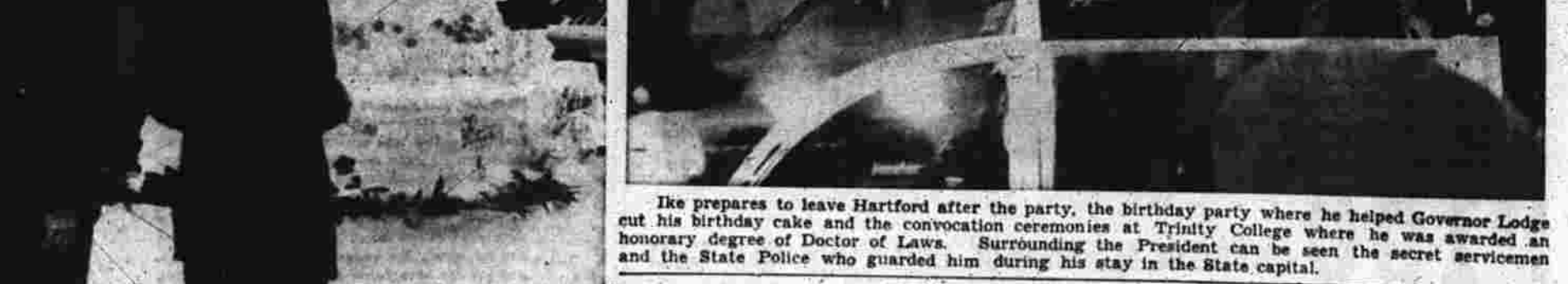
