National Issues

If this were just another midterm election, it would be just a matter of specific national issues. The fact that the Eisenhower administration has demonstrated unusual courage and competence in its resolution of the farm problem—or the fact that it has snubbed the Ho on the Texas-Yukon-Yukon—has become a matter of merely subsidiary issues.

Voting would be a business of giving plus market to Eisenhower administration for its specific advances, and successes, and minus marks for its mistakes or failures.

Or it could be a business of reacting to President Eisenhower's noble pronouncement about being liberal in the realm of human need and conservative in other areas—or reacting to one of Secretary Wilson's foot-in-mouth remarks.

All these things are present in the campaign, and perhaps capable of some influence one way or another. There are, however, oratorical excesses present in the campaign, too, and the only hope, with regard to this, is that they do not influence anybody, one way or the other.

But the real issues in the campaign do not seem to get much public discussion. Yet it is only as they illustrate these real and basic issues that the more specific instances of actual accomplishment or effort or failure in office—have a valid significance.

The first major national issue is the question of the American can people want to do about a certain concept of government—a concept called the "middle way."

This is the philosophical concept of government on which President Eisenhower campaigned, and on which he was elected, and by which he has guided his policy decisions since he has been in office.

The country, harassed for 20 years by a struggle between an extremely liberal administration in power and an extremely reactionary challenger out of power, was sick for the "middle road" of healing and adjustment when Eisenhower proposed it.

Even as it was proposed, the "middle road" drew sneers from the liberal Democrats who were in power, and from the reactionary Republicans who thought their concepts represented the only convincing answer to the liberation of Democrats.

It has been no path of roses, in office. On some issues, the Eisenhower leadership has created a middle bloc in Congress. On others, the extreme have leagued together powerfully enough to defeat the middle way proposal.

And now, as it tries to wage a political campaign for it, the middle way is not having a very happy time of it. Some of the Republican leaders who are presumably campaigning for it, like Vice President Nixon, are not very intelligent or appealing. The party organization, still to some degree in the hands of those who do not relish the middle way, has alienated many of the Republican members of Congress who might be best qualified to speak for it.

The Democratic opposition is busy distorting the middle way in an effort to make it seem exactly the thing the more extreme right wing Republicans wish it were.

The true central issue in the campaign is getting rough treatment, with Republican campaigners sometimes as guilty of feeling it as are the Democratic campaigners. This present campaign may, in fact, reach a new high in the questionable and reprehensible business of ignoring the right of each individual to poison the air everybody breathes.

The unhappy war between the worth of a candidate and what is considered effective and necessary campaigning for him has seldom been more sharply delineated than in the case of Governor John Lodge.

From the professional campaign view, we suppose, these plays were there and could be made and there were had to be made. Nevertheless, even from the professional point of view, the doing of gib things in the part of a candidate who might have the public appearance weak-

This is the kind of high level thing usually distained, and sometimes feared, by the professional campaigners, and certainly it was the type of thing a political manager would ever voluntarily include in his candidate's schedule. Yet, in the event, Governor Lodge's performance in this unheeded test of his knowledge on issues, on the state's business, and test, as well of his personal principles, clearly stood out as the one single thing in his campaign which did him more good through out Connecticut, than all the rest of his campaigning put together.

He did not do anything on which Lodge had hittered seemed weak—favorable comment on everybody's Main Street.
