with that other Republican miracle—the lowest farm prices and the highest living costs—in the same time.

Stevenson said the Republican party is "deeply, hopelessly divided," but that is one issue on which they are solidly united. He added:

"If they can't achieve any other form of unity; if they can't maintain a strong and consistent policy in foreign affairs, in defense, in economic policy, in civil liberties and the separation of powers—in the gateway field the administration's philosophy appears to be clear, its purpose fixed, its determination unshakable."

"From taxes to atomic energy, from TVA to hell's canyon and the Dixie-Vacac contract, from oil too timber to grazing lands, from tariffs to the REA, there seems to be a vigorous consistency in transferring from the many to the few."

Nixon, who has scheduled a talk at Long Beach, Calif., today, was greeted by the largest audience of his current campaign tour at Corvallis, Ore. He told 2,000 people in an afternoon session at the Oregon State College basketball coliseum there that "the Democrats have run out of gas... our campaign is on the upgrade and steadily climbing since two weeks ago."

In an address at Portland last night, the Vice President said "a vote for an anti-Stevenson Congress will be a vote to return the Truman-Acheson policy which did terrible damage to America the seven years after World War II."

He urged re-election of Sen. Guy Cordon (R-Ore), who is opposed by Democrat Richard L. Newberger, a state senator and author of a bill to curtail the respect for the United States has fallen to an all-time low. Mitchell said he had employer reports of hiring plans in Michigan, Indiana, California, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Massachusetts, Ohio and Iowa.

Lands like Program

He said Eisenhower tax credit, Social Security, housing and foreign policies have brought peace, stability, growing economic strength and government economy. He recalled there were 4,684,000 unemployed in February 1950, when the Truman administration was in power.

"To us of the Eisenhower administration," he said, "a man who is out of a job and wants one is not just a statistic on a card. He is an individual American who needs work in order to provide for himself and his family. He deserves and is getting the full assistance and best efforts of our government to help provide him with job opportunities."

Commerce Dept. figures showed the decline in unemployment between September and October was the largest in any single month since April 1951, when the Korean defense production boom was getting well under way.

About 4.2 per cent of the labor force was jobless in October as against 4.5 per cent in March when national production hit both a record and a low.

Farm employment declined half a million, as usual after the peak harvest season, to a total of 7,200,000.

union stopped all bus and street car traffic to prepare a mammoth reception ceremony for Nasser this afternoon. Nasser left Alexandria by train this morning but his arrival in Cairo was delayed by stops at stations along the route where pro-government demonstrators were reported being routed.

There was no comment from the government on reports that security police were rounding up Brotherhood members but dozens of persons in the Imbaba district of Cairo, home of one of the four suspects, were taken into custody for questioning.

In the incident last night in Alexandria's Liberation Square, an electric light bulb near the Premier was shattered by five bottles and two minor officials were out by flying glass.

The 36-year-old Nasser continued his speech and two hours later the Egyptian state broadcast system retransmitted the address. Listeners could hear the shouts and Nasser's emotion-packed words to the crowd.

"Let them kill me," he cried, "I have already established freedom, dignity and pride in Egypt. My blood for you. My life for you. After the criminal attempt against my life, I assure you that my life is yours and will be spent for you... I am from you and for you."

Eye-witnesses attempted to persuade the Premier to stop his speech, but he insisted on continuing.

Police reported that a mob seized an Egyptian workman in the front row of the thousands who had gathered to scale the last obstacles to obtaining his freedom.

Part of the decline in sales was attributed to a sharp reduction in GM's defense business. Sales of military items were down 40 per cent from the first nine months of 1953.

The second major national issue in this campaign has some relationship to the first. It is primarily a political matter, but it is one of those party issues which also happens to be a national issue.

It might be a snap judgment that this issue is not particularly important for the ordinary voter, who is concerned merely with deciding between what the existing parties offer him, and who bears responsibility for what these parties happen to make of themselves.

But such a snap judgment is already belied by what happened in the 1952 campaign. Then millions of American voters did have, as a major part of their reason for voting for a certain candidate, the idea that he might be able to bring about a constructive and beneficial change in the character of a certain political party.

So, although the battle without was the Republican party, the battle within was the Republican party. The voters were voting to restore the two party system. But they were voting to do so only on the assumption that the Republican party had finally made itself more worthy of their support, and on the further assumption that the man they were electing would continue and consolidate his reforming role within the Republican party.

It was no secret, either, that the gravest problem the Republican party faced, within itself, was the problem of McCarthyism, of the grip on the party and on the nation. And many voters went to Eisenhower precisely because they thought he would have the standing and the ability to handle that problem, whereas the Democrats had already demonstrated that they never could handle it.

What has happened to this position of the Eisenhower mission—to rebuild the Republican party and to handle the problem of McCarthyism—has been impressive but it is not yet final. One thing is certain.

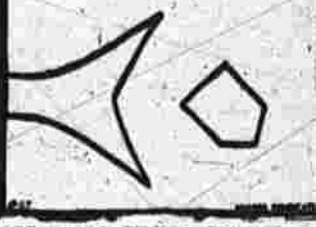

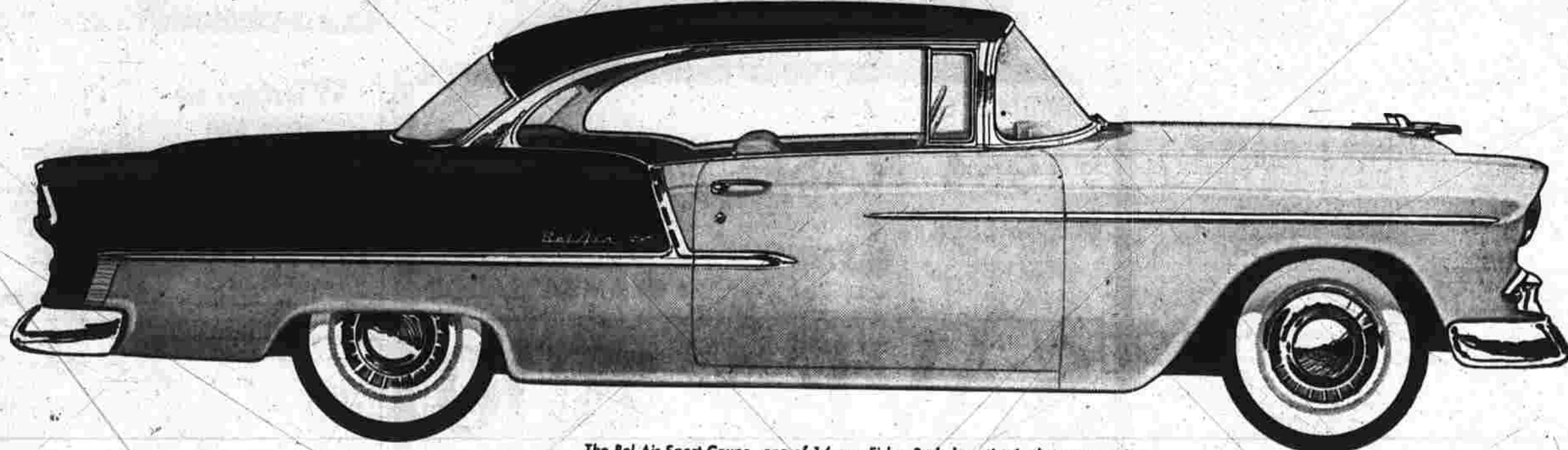

The Doctor Says

Fatigue and Fever, Early Signs of This Rare Disease

By EDWIN F. JORDAN, M.D. Written for NEA Service. "I have recently been told," writes M. K. "that I have Lupus erythematosus. I do not know exactly what about this disease but have been told that I must keep out of the sun entirely. Would you please discuss it?"

This disease, which was formerly considered rather rare, may be increasing at any rate there seems to be a great deal of interest in it. At times it appears to affect the skin alone and only a fraction of the body, and at other times it is so frequent that it is considered rather than as a skin disease. The disease seems to involve certain tissues of the body which are the binding substances for the blood vessels. This tissue is called collagenous tissue. It has been studied a good deal in recent years but our knowledge of the functions and diseases is still far from clear. Weakness, fatigue, and fever are common early signs of Lupus. Unlike many diseases accompanied by fever, there is a low white-blood count, that is, smaller than average number of white blood cells in the blood. Pains in the joints are also common.

Speakeasy Rears Head in Moscow

Moscow, Oct. 27 (AP)—A basement speakeasy is doing a roaring business with the full connivance of local authorities in Moscow's Kirovsky District, according to the newspaper Soviet Trade. The paper printed the full address of the underground establishment. Such speakeasies are appearing here and there throughout the city since many "drink and run" stalls and other drinking establishments were closed because of the current anti-alcohol campaign. Soviet Trade said the speakeasy was formerly a good public dining room. A few months ago, however, it "closed for repairs" and when it reopened took to selling only beer. Soviet Trade said this was because "the heads of the trust for running public houses in the Kirovsky region wanted to make more profit." Ivan Zakhvatkin was installed as manager and in the paper's word, "quickly organized on this hidden place barrels of beer and cases of cognac."

"This would be a very important convenience to Manchester lawyers, litigants and witnesses and there is no reason I can see why we should not have it. To my mind, this should be one of the most important pieces of legislation for Manchester in the next session of the General Assembly."

Rabbi Feldman Reviews American Way of Life

Rabbi Abraham J. Feldman of Temple Beth Israel in West Hartford was guest speaker at the October meeting of the Women's Club of Manchester held Monday evening at the South Methodist Church. The rabbi reviewed, with distinction and charm, the new book, "American Way of Life," by George R. Stewart, published by Doubleday. He prefaced his comments on the book by speaking of the American way of life as the primary value of people rather than state, our belief in inalienable rights and freedoms. "These doctrines of ours," he said, "are stronger in our minds today, by reason of the nature and stress of the times than they have been in several generations past. In contrast," he continued, "to more accurately supporting and contributing to the American way of life, our customs, culture, the mechanics of daily living and experience, and these things are dealt with in Stewart's book. Stewart is a professor at the University of California, and he has written not a novel, or a book with a plot and a happy ending, but a book which is a preachment or call to crusading, or a "highly descriptive" of our national mood.

Refreshment Book According to Rabbi Feldman, the book is done in a "popular style" and is a refreshing and relaxing in the midst of the great bulk of weighty literature being published in these days. The theme of the book is the analysis of various strands of our national heredity, and the pointing up of the problem as to how immigrants and exiles from many sources have fused themselves into a single nation. Business and professions, family relationships are not dealt with, but such topics as language, religion, food and drink, play, sports, the arts, holidays, etc., are dealt with. Some examples of the influence of heredity, or the lack of such, were noted by the reviewer. For example, the custom of eating up to the recent casual dress of the past years, was according to the style pattern set in the old countries, "arguing has been largely dominated by heredity. So has religion, though there is a decided American aspect now to a branch of it, as contrasted to the same religious roots in the old world."

Certain habits of play are distinctly American. Baseball was originated here as late as 1881. Baseball, though similar to some older games, is also American, and the term "club" associated with it because in its early days it was a "gentleman's game" played by the membership of actual clubs formed for the purpose. The section of the book the rabbi chose to review at greatest length was on holidays. Christmas, besides being the most important, is the most recent. Though the German and Dutch colonists celebrated it, and likewise the Church of England settlers in Virginia, it was frowned upon by the Puritans, who enacted laws to stamp out its observance as something worldly and even pagan. Dutch Customs Thanksgiving, on the other hand, is strictly American in origin and was brought into being by the Puritans themselves. New Year's was introduced here before there were American settlements, and it was introduced here by the Dutch. Easter is the greatest of church festivals, and is not, of course, native in its beginnings. Contrasted with these, the Fourth of July, Labor Day, Armistice Day (but little observed now, since World War II) and Washington's and Lincoln's Birthdays are entirely American. Many other of the lesser holidays were discussed with interesting facts concerning them. Rabbi Feldman never lost sight, as the author of the book does not, of the original premise, that the heredity and environment of the American, like the same influence in the life of an individual, can be traced and analyzed as to their sources, and their effects on the many phases of our national life. Most stimulating of all is the assurance that, however much these ways may be modified or even almost completely changed, our American way remains the same. Following the rabbi's talk, a social hour was enjoyed with tea and coffee and Danish pastries served from attractive caddy lighted tables. Mrs. Edward J.
