Red China claimed today it has caught 230 American and Chiang Kai-shek agents in China since 1951, and said 106 of them were killed.

A government communique broadcast by Peiping radio did not say how many American subjects were included in this total, or if any Americans were killed.

It charged the agents were dropped by plane into China by the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) and the Free China Movement, It called the latter "a subordinate of the VIA" and the Nationalist Chinese on Formoss.

The Communists also reported capture of large quantities of ammunition, radio sets, gold and money and other supplies dropped into China to supply these alleged agents.

The communique, from the Public Security Ministry, said John Thomas Downey of New Britain, Conn., and Col. John Knox Arnold, Jr., of Silver Springs, MD., sentenced yesterday to long prison terms on espionage charges, "were among these air-dropped agents."

Downey, a civilian employe of the U.S. State Dept. had protested the imprisonment, and Arnold, commander of a downed B29, to 10 years by a Red Chinese military court which also imposed sentences on 20 others, 11 Americans and nine Chinese.
