Nation-wide television viewers last Friday night had an opportunity to view the highlights of last Thursday morning's running of the 19th annual Five Mile Road Race. Planned shots were carried on John Cameron Sawyer's cast to Coast Channel Network.

The race was also featured on WNET-TV last Thursday night, several hours after the actual running of the race. Members of the Associated Press gave the event extensive coverage.

General Chairman Wilbert Hadden reported today that a total of 196,000 was collected from the crowd of 10,000 last Thursday Day morning before and during the running of the race.
