### Plane Wreck Found; Two Dead, Five Hurt

Milan, N. H., Dec. 2 (AP)—Searchers found a wrecked Northeast Airlines plane snow-covered Monday. Success today and two of its seven occupants—marooned since midday Tuesday in near-zero temperature—were dead.

Five survivors, including the plane's stewardess, the only woman aboard, were removed by helicopter and taken to a Berlin hospital. A veteran flier on his day-off discovered the wreckage this morning after a score of planes flew over the area, mistaking the snow-covered wreckage for a plane that had crashed.

The survivors were: Pilot Capt. W. Peter Carey, 37, of Swampscott, Mass., the most seriously injured; stewardess Mary L. McCullough, 28, of Boston, and three passengers, James W. Harvey, 40, of Waterville, Me.; W. Miller of Philadelphia; and Daniel J. Hall of Montclair, N. J.

All but Carey were able to walk from the helicopter which transferred them from the bleak mountain top to the Berlin hospital. They were about eight miles from the scene of the crash.

### Consumers Get Few Breaks In Business Price Battles

By SAM DAWSON  
New York, Dec. 2 (AP)—Prices of finished goods and raw materials are caught in a tug-of-war today with consumers getting a break here and there.

Price weakness in some lines—piling counter to the usual upward pull of advancing business activity—is being watched closely by businessmen planning their next year's schedules.

of regular gasoline in that state range from 20 to 26 cents a gallon.

Prices on the new automobile models are pretty well scrambled this time. Many entirely new models are out, making comparison impossible. With others there have been some price hikes, credit to rating costs. But these have often been offset by a drop in freight charges.

Dealers enter the picture with their varying policies on trade-in allowances. And the consumer planning to buy a new car is fretting shopping hard for price concessions.

At the manufacturing level the interest centers on recent price weakness in some raw materials. Twelve major oil companies are accused of violating state laws by offering rebates and discounts. Retail prices

pull prices in the opposite direction.

The price of steel scrap, for example, has been taking the low road of late, although steel mills are increasing output and scrap prices usually rise at such a time. Some mills explain they laid in good supplies of scrap last fall. Others report they have been putting more pig iron and less scrap in their mix.

Copper scrap prices have been weak of late, too, although the strike-caused shortage in refined copper still continues. But rising costs of labor and of some metals, like zinc, which it uses along with copper, are given by Chase Brass & Copper as the reasons for raising prices on its products. 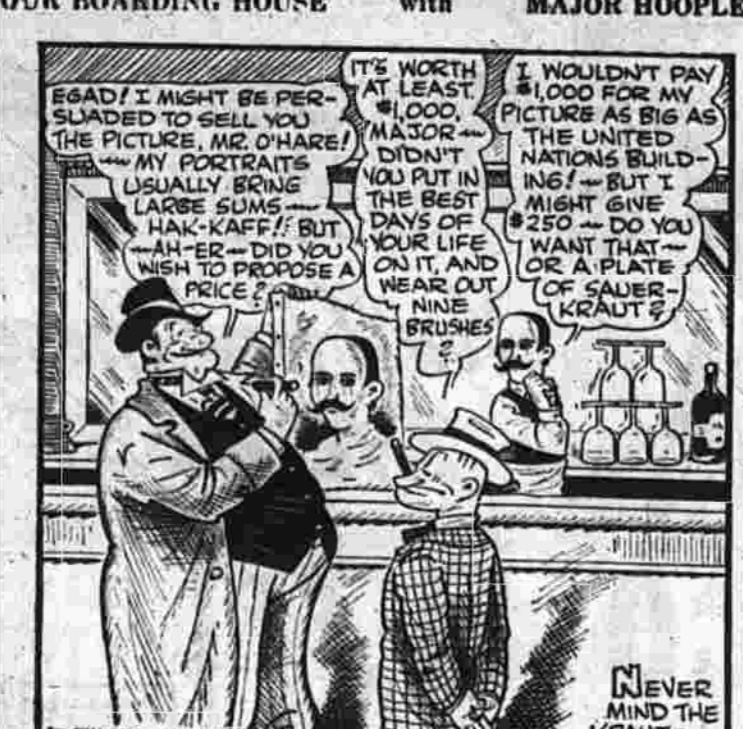
