Nazis Receive Pension, Victims Are By-Passed

Munich, Germany, Dec. 9 (AP)—A leading German newspaper cites cases where war criminals' families are receiving benefits denied to Jewish victims of wartime atrocities.

Under the heading "the scandal of restitution," the *Bundeszeitung* gives these comparisons:

The wife of a convicted German war criminal in the U.S. prison at Landsberg receives a regular pension from the Bonn government.

The widow of a Jew slain by SS men in a Latvian ghetto gets nothing.

At 78 she isn't eligible under the program for restitution payments to Nazi victims, because it is impossible for her to prove the identity of the killers.

When the 27,000 residents of the ghetto was massacred, no one was left to bear witness.

Hertha Ehlert, once jailed for helping to murder inmates of Berlin Concentration Camp, shares in government payments made to former prisoners of war.

But a Jew thrown into a concentration camp was denied restitution payments.

A German court said the camp's starvation diet actually had helped him, because he had full stomach and a lack of food was good treatment.

that agencies blow up their budget requests and ask for much more than they expect to get.

Ribicoff began allowing signs of the strain of his busy budget hearing schedule as he headed out on his next to the last day of budget during the past day or two.

Newburgh, Sherratt's Committee member Flin E. Engleman said pupil enrollment and costs have been increasing faster than the amount of the grants, so that today the assistance received by towns from the State amounts to about 25 per cent.

That was one of the statements made by Engleman yesterday in a conference with Ribicoff currently conferring with State Dept., agency and institution representatives about their budget needs.

Asks 50 Per Cent More

Engleman proposed to Ribicoff that the Education Dept. budget for the 1955-56 biennium be increased by 50 per cent to add new personnel in the teachers colleges and vocational schools and to undertake a \$10,000,000 building program.

The education commissioner pointed these figures at the income tax revenues and annual deficit rate currently standing at 48,000 more than double that of 20 years ago, a total of \$65,000,000 enrollment of 327,000 and an estimated \$100,000,000 deficit.

Eight years hence, he said, the figures mean there will be 400,000 more school rooms, more teachers and more aid for towns which scarcely can pay their present deficit costs now.

When Ribicoff asked what should be done, Engleman said among other things, that the present formula for granting aid to towns favors the smaller communities without regard to their degree of need, and should be improved.

The Commissioner said he favored granting aid on the basis of an equalized grand list, but noted that every attempt to get the legislature to approve such a method had failed.
